

- according to your love remember me, for you, Lord, are good. Psalm 25:4-7

One of the first classes I had to take in college was "Speech 101". Throughout the semester, the professor would assign types of speeches and we could choose whatever topic to speak about. One of the best speeches given in the class was called "Paper or Plastic". The student spoke for several minutes about the choice we all routinely faced at the grocery store. He explored the pros and cons of paper and plastic for carrying groceries. He discussed the environmental impact of paper and plastic. He gave many ways each type of bag could be reused. The student spoke about this common choice for at least 5 minutes longer than the 2 seconds of thought I had ever given the choice before.

We all face choices every day. What should I eat for lunch? Should I bring an umbrella when I go out? Is this job good for me or do I need to look for something else? How should I respond to my coworker, neighbor, child, or spouse? Some choices are simple, some have more complex repercussions. Some choices are easy to make, while others take careful deliberation. Some choices have little effect on others, some we make because of their effect. We see the effects of some choices right away, while others' accumulate over time.

The choices we make are based on our core values. As Christians, our values are based on the Lord's truth – we are created and redeemed by God. We are led by the Holy Spirit to live His way. Our choices throughout life affect those around us – and God gives us roles as parents and leaders that specifically affect those in our care. There was a time when we were able to count on our culture to encourage good choices or at least to honor choices made with God's values. Today, parents and leaders face the challenge of a culture that ignores or is even hostile to God. Satan is using good things around us – especially family and sports – to pull us away from God's truth. For example, parents and leaders are forced to choose either community sports or Sunday worship. The choice in the moment is made for the sake of life development, but families are now forced to choose between effects on life and effects on eternal life.

We know we do not make perfect choices, but live in the forgiveness of God. We do not "go on sinning so grace may increase", we seek to grow in following the Lord – first, because God is God and second because we know His way is best for us. The forgiveness of God covers each and every choice. Growing in God's way is less about the specific choice in the moment and more about the habit the choice is forming. The moment is forgiven, but God's Word tells us there are habits that lead to hell. We praise God for His gift of guidance – through His Word directed by the Holy Spirit. Who, then, are those who fear the Lord? He will instruct them in the ways they should choose. (Psalm 25:12)

We praise God for the gift of forgiveness in Christ Jesus. May we encourage one another in His family in this hostile world as we make choices together for today and for eternity.

BIBLE STUDY IN OCTOBER


Invite your friends and neighbors to Sunday morning Bible Study – we have coffee and goodies!




