

from the heavens. You are one of eight billion people on Earth and Earth is one planet of eight (or nine) around our sun (which is just one among millions in the universe). Gazing at the stars on a winter's night or studying the planets and stars gives a certain life perspective.

Then the Lord God formed a man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and the man became a living being. Genesis 2:7

On Christmas Eve, December 24, 1968, the crew of Apollo 8 read from the Book of Genesis as they orbited the Moon. Astronauts Bill Anders, Jim Lovell, and Frank Borman, the first humans to travel to the Moon, read the first 10 verses of the Creation narrative. As they broadcast their Christmas message, it was a great reminder that God is the Creator of all

things - "the heavens and the earth" - no matter what your perspective... if you are standing on earth or are looking at it

O Lord, our Lord,

how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory above the heavens.

³ When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers,

the moon and the stars, which you have set in place,

4 what is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him? Psalm 8:1,3,4

But God, the Creator and Ruler of the Universe, does

not stay distant from His creation. When it comes to mankind - God is "hand's on". God's Word tells us God spoke the world into existance. But when it came to creating humans, God formed them - both male (Genesis 2:7) and female. Then the Lord God made a woman from the rib he had taken out of the man, and he brought her to the man. (Genesis 2:22) So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. (Genesis 1:27)

Even when people disobeyed God, He did not stay distant. He continued to guide His creation in many ways - including through His divine presence interacting with them. And when the time was right, God Himself chose to be born into His creation in the most humble way. Our Creator was born in our world in order to die. He died to conquor death and restore His creation to Himself.

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. John 1:14

And God does not stay distant today. God, the creator and ruler of the universe, comes to us intimately in His Word and at His table – as we take in the very body and blood of the Savior – together as God gathers us in worship each week. We receive Jesus' presence and promise "I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you forever". (John 14:16) May you know the presence of Immanuel, God with us, this season and every day.






