Reflections on Worship Attendance

[Based upon thoughts from a book by Eugene Peterson, translator of **THE MESSAGE**; and found in Chapter 2 "Christ Plays in Creation"]

As I attend worship services at Prince of Peace, I miss seeing many of our friends who attended regularly over the past 12 years. My heart is troubled, and I yearn for fellowship with the very folks who encouraged us in our faith when we faced the death of our daughter and as I adjusted to the new life of being a "retired" pastor. Because of health reasons and circumstances in churches that I was helping to pastor, I am now more regular in attending at POP. Seeing so few people at Thanksgiving Eve worship, and even at Christmas Eve worship has me concerned for you, my brothers and sisters, whom I have not seen for some time. I talked with Pastor John about how the Spirit of God seemed to be nudging me to speak up about the feelings of emptiness and loneliness at worship. He encouraged me to put my thoughts on paper. This came to climax when I was reading a book entitled: CHRIST PLAYS IN TEN THOUSAND PLACES. I realized that with so many of our congregation not attending worship like they did before the Covid-19 crisis, I did not see the rich fellowship of friends in Christ. Reading about why Christians worship and what we hope to see happen in our walk with Jesus made me want to share some of what God is saying to me with as many as possible. I HOPE YOU WILL SPEND A FEW MINUTES OF YOUR BUSY TIME, READING THESE MUSINGS.

Why do we gather at the church for worship? Is it to "get something out of it," or is it to give something to each other? Are we just trying to obey a Commandment the Lord has given: "Remember the Sabbath Day to keep it holy?" Or are we trying to be faithful to our Creator? As Christians, we have a long-standing history of gathering on The Lord's Day, specifically on a day scheduled by our church, i.e., Saturday or Sunday. The church sees this as a fulfillment of Genesis, chapters 1 and 2, where God intends that each of us are to find our purpose for living in the pattern of His Creation.

There is concern in Christian congregations across our country for the pattern of worship attendance that has developed through the Covid-19 protocols. At the time, they were regulations that were intended to save us from the evil of disease and death, but the result is that through the cancellation of many things, even our times of worship, it has caused many people to ignore the pattern that God established in His Creation: "Six days you shall work, but the seventh day is a SABBATH unto the Lord."

The Church has always understood that we live not only in thanks to God, but that we live with a healthy fear and reverence. It is the way we show God that we know ALL Creation is His, and that we will use it well and use it meaningfully. This involves all of life: our growth, our learning, our working and our play. And yes, our worship of the Lord who makes all things possible for us.

The Church, in doing its mission, cultivates the truth that "We believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth." How do we do this? How do we live so that the wonder and astonishment of being God's children is not taken lightly, but with awe and reverence? (Exodus 20:8-11)

We do it by "keeping the Sabbath." The early Christian Church put its stamp on the Third Commandment by the translation: "Keep the Lord's Day." The striking thing about keeping the Sabbath is that it begins by not doing anything. The Hebrew word SHABBAT, which we take over into our language untranslated, simply means: **Quit...Stop...Take a break.**

The word, as it exists, has no religious content. It says: Whatever you are doing, stop it...whatever you are saying, shut up...sit down and look around you...Don't do anything...Fold your hands and take a deep breath. That is what **shabbat** means. God rested as part of His creation work, and so should we.

God has done and IS DOING; so, begin by not doing anything: Just **ATTEND**, **ADORE**, **and AMEN**. Genesis 2:1-4 reveals the 7th Day not-doing, in other words, took place in the context of much-doing. God had created US, and "ALL that we have in support of this body and life," to quote Luther in his explanation of the 1st Article of The Creed. We do well to enter into an appreciation of our created work and life, by just stopping on a Saturday night or a Sunday morning and watch and listen to our Creator. Let HIM equip us for the rest of our week in HIS Creation.

Human not-doing became a day of God-honoring. SABBATH is a deliberate act of interference, an interruption of our work each week. It is a decree of no-work, so we are able to notice, to attend, to orient OUR WORK in the WORK OF GOD.

It looks very much as if Genesis points to the Sabbath Day as the clue to the MEANING OF CREATION. Reading the Genesis account, we notice how different the 7th Day is described in contrast to the first six Days. In the narration of each of the first six Days, the first line and the last line are the same for each of those days. There are frequent repetitions of familiar words and phrases in each day's description.

Both of these features are abandoned in the describing of the 7th Day. Here the day's number is repeated three times—Seventh...Seventh...Seventh...Seventh...Seventh...seventh

God thought it was important enough to be included in the 10 Commands. They are recorded two places in Scripture. The wording is similar in both places, but the reasons supporting the commands, is different. The reason given in Exodus is that this is what God did. He worked 6 days and quit working on the 7th. (Exodus 20:8-11) The reason given in Deuteronomy is that when God's people were slaves in Egypt it was work, work, work, work---incessant, unrelieved work; they must NEVER THEMSELVES perpetuate such oppression; they must quit work each 7th day so that their slaves and livestock and children will get a day off. (Deuteronomy 5:12-15)

The Exodus reason supports a life of believing in God—Sabbath keeping is a way of getting in on what God does. We keep time with God. Sabbath keeping preserves and honors time as God's gift of holy rest: it erects a weekly fortress against the idea that WE made time, against reducing time to money, against reducing time to what we can get out of it, against leaving no time for God or beauty or anything that cannot be purchased. It is a defense against the hurrying that desecrates TIME.

The Deuteronomy reason supports a life of love---Sabbath keeping is a way to love your neighbor, a simple act of justice. This command to observe the Sabbath is backed by a sense of social justice and neighborhood. We remember the Sabbath and rest on it in order to enter into and maintain the freedom of creation, to experience and share God's deliverance of others and love for others. Sabbath keeping preserves and honors TIME as God's gift of holy freedom. It erects a WEEKLY FORTRESS against our laziness and procrastination, that lets injustice flourish because we are not attending in holy obedience and adoring love to the people and animals and things God has placed around us for our blessing.

We are in the **process of building** a place for God's work to be done, both for the "Exodus Reason" and the "Deuteronomy Reason." It will be a place for Family equipping and for us to live out the mission God has given to us. The point of building a place of worship is to realize and extend Creation through human reenactment. This is done not only by prayer and praise, but by rehearsing and embracing the Commandments and promises and blessings in order to put them into the creation in which we live. That's why Pastor John has done a series of sermons on The Apostles Creed, and why his next series will be on the Ten Commandments. **Saturday at 5:30 pm and Sunday mornings are times when you can determine to embrace these Words of God. These are IMPORTANT TIMES for EACH of us. Please join your brothers and sisters in the FAITH by making the decision to gather in the Lord's House each Lord's Day.**


Please be aware while entering and exiting the parking lot.


