Give praise to the Lord, proclaim his name; make known among the nations what he has done. Sing to him, sing praise to him; tell of all his wonderful acts. Glory in his holy name; let the hearts of those who seek the Lord rejoice. Look to the Lord and his strength; seek his face always. Remember the wonders he has done, his miracles, and the judgments he pronounced, you his servants, the descendants of Israel, his chosen ones, the children of Jacob. He is the Lord our God; his judgments are in all the earth. He remembers his covenant forever, the promise he made, for a thousand generations, I Chronicles 16:8-15

God's Word constantly tells us to REMEMBER. Remember what God has done. Remember who we are. Remember whose we are. Even as God was rescuing His people from Egypt, they are told to "Remember this day when you came out of Egypt, where you were slaves. For by the strength of his hand the Lord brought you out from there." Exodus 13:3

They are to have special days and seasons set aside to remember God's work in the life of His people.

The season of Lent (40 days before Easter) is a season of remembering. We are told on Ash Wednesday "Remember that you are dust and to dust you will return." It is a sobering reminder of who we are before our Creator. Throughout Lent, we reflect on this truth – without God, we are doomed in our sin. But the "40 days" of Lent do not include the Sundays (go ahead, count it up for yourself). Each Sunday (throughout the year and especially in Lent) is a mini-Easter. We celebrate the Living Lord. And we do

exactly what Jesus commands at His table, "Do this in Remembrance of Me". I Corinthains 11:24-25

"Remembering" in God's Word is not simply "recalling the fact of..." We are not simply reminded that something happened once. "Remembering" also includes an element of "reliving". God's people for thousands of years have "Remembered" God's rescue from Egypt by sharing the Passover meal – including hours of questions and answers which retell (and in the food, even reenact) the events of the Passover and Exodus. When we share Communion, we are not just "Recalling that it happened", we are reliving and sharing in the Lord's Supper with Christians of all time and place.

Remembering is not always easy. In daily life, we are often distracted by the immediate needs – of ourselves, our family, jobs, those around us. We are focused on today – and often worried about tomorrow. By remembering – retelling and reliving – what God has done throughout history, and what God IS doing today, we are empowered by God for the future. Jesus promises this remembering as a gift of the Holy Spirit. "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you." John 14:26

As God gathers us in Worship, we are refreshed in the remembering. When we remember what God has done in all our yesterdays, we are reminded that yes, God can handle this day and the next.


