Noticing that Jesus had given them a good answer, he asked him, "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?" he asked him, "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?" ²⁹ "The most important one," answered Jesus, "is this: 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. ³⁰ Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength.' ³¹ The second is this: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these." Mark 12:28-31

I am sitting in my desk chair trying to decide if I should go for a walk, take a bike ride, or go to the gym. My chair is comfortable enough. I have work to do (like writing for the Proclaimer). Exercise would mean changing my clothes, getting uncomfortable, taking time away from the many other good tasks of the day. But I know I should exercise. I've been told it's good for me. I have even experienced the benefits to my body, mind, and soul. But there are other good things that often seem to take priority.

There are many reasons people do not "go to church" – gather with God's people to receive His gifts.

- + Sometimes we are physically unable to get to church due to illness or recovering from a procedure. (In these cases, I would love to "bring church to you" visit you with God's Word and Sacrament. Please contact me!)
- + Sometimes we have good reasons
 - schedule conflicts with work or kids' sports, family gatherings, need for sleeping in.
 Sleep/rest is good. Family gatherings are good God gives the good gift of family.
 Sports are a great way for kids (and adults) to learn cooperation and many other lessons in maturity (and to get some exercise!)

A friend of mine tells the story (which I have used in many ways) of when his daughter was 5 years old. They went to the grocery store for ice cream. She wanted the good ice cream (Rocky Road). But the grocery store was out of it. They went across town, but that store was closed. They went to a third store and, wonderfully, they had Rocky Road! (Perhaps this is a story about perseverance.) But as they were about to get the "good ice cream", my friend's daughter saw... IT... not the good ice cream, but the BEST dessert – Drumsticks. They had to choose to set aside the good ice cream for the best dessert.

How often do we go for what is good, immediate, and temporary... but miss out on what is best and eternal? What good will it be for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul? Matthew 16:26 Perhaps, like me, you are feeling the guilt of having made the good choice in the past. Then be reminded that God's best, eternal gift – is His forgiveness. God's grace in Jesus Christ covers you, your life, your past decisions! God gives all good gifts. And the goodness of the gifts is seen by the light of the best – God's mercy and love for you. Let's encourage one another to receive God's best gifts together. And to exercise our faith in His love.

And now I think I'll contemplate God's gifts for soul, mind, and body... and go for a bike ride.

LIFEWISE ACADEMY

LIFEWISE ACADEMY

Would you like to see a Bible Education Program started for students in the Oregon City School District?

The work is in progress to have classes of children from all three elementary schools in Oregon attending LifeWise classes by the end of 2025. Pastor Don is available to sit down with individuals and couples to share the Plan, and to build an awareness of how these classes can become a reality in our community.

LifeWise Academy offers Bible education for public school students during school hours. Almost no one knows this is possible. LifeWise Academy is bringing this back like it was when some of our elder members were in school and attended a church. Under a little-known Supreme Court ruling, which has been upheld multiple times, LifeWise empowers communities to provide Bible education and development of character traits for their public-school students during school hours.

There are three conditions:

- 1. **Off school property.** Upon the completion of our new family life resource center, we would be in a position to host some of these classes for a nearby Elementary School.
- 2. **Privately funded**. Since no government funds can be used for this program, it would be wise and good to have the support of many churches in our community. This is a process of letting many know how they can be participants in this mission.
- 3. **Parent permitted**. Parental permission is required for a child's participation. Therefore, it is each family's choice once it is organized and available to them. This too is in the process of happening, especially for Coy School which will have their classes in our Family Resource Center classrooms.

According to a 2024 national poll, more than 75% of Americans believe public school students need moral and character education. And more than half of all Americans support the teaching of biblical values to public school students. LifeWise Academy makes that possible and gives local folks like us an opportunity to volunteer and help in the process. It is already happening in 1,000 school districts, Coast to Coast, located in 33 states.

Watch for an opportunity to hear more and ask questions about LifeWise here at Prince of Peace. You may even find an opportunity to help this effort for the ministry to children.
