From the Vicar's Desk April 2020

When I saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead. But he laid his right hand on me, saying, "Fear not, I am the first and the last, and the living one. I died, and behold I am alive forevermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades. — Revelation 1:17–18

For many generations now, humanity has viewed itself as the course-setter of its own destiny. This isn't really new, sinful man has always believed himself to be in control. But with the everadvanced pace of science and technology, man finally seems to have gained the level of control that previous generations could only dream of. We've split the atom, mapped the human genome, and put men on the moon—what *can't* we do?

The COVID-19 virus has done much to deflate our hubris, however. Seemingly overnight we were reminded that there are forces beyond our control. We were reminded that science doesn't have all the answers, and that technology cannot always fix everything. Above all, we were reminded that we are mortal, and that life is a preciously fleeting thing.

In some ways, it's fitting that all of this came to a head during the season of Lent. During Lent we are constantly reminding ourselves of the depths of our sinfulness, and remembering that death is the wage due for all who sin (Romans 6:23). The truth is, even if COVID-19 had stayed in Wuhan, or even if had never come about at all, death remains. Life can be taken abruptly, whether by disease, accident, violence, or otherwise. Death is the fruit of sin, and all have sinned.

But it doesn't end there. Lent is always undertaken in preparation for Easter. We consider our sins so that we understand the magnitude of God's great love for us, that He would give His Son to be our Savior from death.

Given the fear raised by this pandemic, we may well be tempted to stay away from church this Easter (though who knows, maybe by the time this reaches you this will all have blown over). But frankly, this is exactly what the devil wants at this time. The devil wants fear to rule the day, for temporary life to win over eternal life.

But it's precisely in times of fear that Easter matters the most. Only Christ has overcome death and the grave. Only Christ possesses the keys of Death and Hades. He can shut the doors that lead to death; He can open the gates that lead to eternal life. It's precisely when the fear of our mortality overwhelms us that we need to hear the message of Christ's triumph over death. That message, and the Messiah Who gave it to us, have been the sole things that has carried the Church throughout the ages. Through war and disaster, plague and famine, only Christ and His Gospel have given His saints strength and life in the face of death. His Sacraments are the only medicine that truly cures the curse of death. Nothing concocted in a laboratory can give this—only Christ can.

So as we continue to pray for the wellbeing of all, and seek to care for those around us, we turn our eyes to the Lord of life. Only in His wounds can we find refuge from the terrors of death. He is our light and our life, and He is faithful to all His promises.

When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written:

- "Death is swallowed up in victory."
- "O death, where is your victory?
- O death, where is your sting?"-1 Corinthians 15:54-55

Coronavirus Update 3/23/2020: Services Suspended

Dear members of Redeemer Lutheran Church, today Indiana Governor Eric Holcomb issued "Executive Order 20-08 (Stay at Home)" beginning March 25 through April 6. While this order exempts religious gatherings as long as they comply with the CDC recommendations, we think it necessary to cancel in-person worship services until April 6.

Since this is a temporary order issued in an emergency situation designed to protect the public health, we do not feel that it infringes upon our religious liberty or our right to assemble. We appreciate our Indiana state government providing an exception for the essential work of churches and those that provide spiritual care. However, we feel our resources can best be used if we suspend in-person worship services and provide quality opportunities to hear the Word of God through other means.

We will record/live-stream services as we are able on YouTube, Facebook, and the Redeemer website. Holy Communion can still be received by making an appointment with Pastor Kleinschmidt. The Church Office will be closed during this time, however, the executive order allows us to maintain the building, ensure security, and gather materials to work from home. Pastor Kleinschmidt and Vicar Stoltzman can be reached at home during the stay at home order, their home phone numbers have been printed in every bulletin. 


