*From Pastor's Desk
May 2020*

"Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or dismayed before the king of Assyria and all the horde that is with him, for there are more with us than with him. ⁸ With him is an arm of flesh, but with us is the Lord our God, to help us and to fight our battles." And the people took confidence from the words of Hezekiah king of Judah. - 2 Chronicles 32:7-8

In some ways this quarantine has been the closest thing to an ancient siege that we modern people may ever experience. We've been walled up in our homes, counting our supplies, wondering how long we can hold out before making a trip to the store, and wondering if we'll even be able to get what we need when we're there. We don't know how long it's going to last. The days are filled with uncertainty, and sometimes, fear.

Yet even at the time of this writing it appears that some restrictions may be lifted for us. But our way of life isn't likely to return to "normal" right away. In many respects, our lives have been altered permanently and we have yet to really see the lasting repercussions of the virus and this quarantine.

In King Hezekiah's time, Israel was besieged by the most powerful force in the world. The Assyrian army had conquered almost everything and turned their enemies in vassal states. When Hezekiah stood in defiance, the might of Assyria quickly marched to besiege his city. While Hezekiah certainly trusted in the Lord to deliver him, he also used his God-given wisdom and smarts to prepare his people. Among other things, blocking off a major source of water for the Assyrians, and redirecting it via tunnel to the pool of Siloam inside the city of Jerusalem for use by Hezekiah's people.

You can tour that tunnel to this very day! Built in the 600s B.C. you can still walk through the 5 foot tall, 24 inch wide tunnel—although the tourism companies advise you to bring a flashlight and a change of clothes as the water can rise up to your neck in places! My point is, we place our trust in God to deliver us, but we also use the brains that God gave us when facing calamity and threat.

Such is our time with this virus. Fact is, there may or may not be bigger threats out there. Does COVID-19 threaten us more because it has a name? What about all the diseases that are out there that we haven't discovered yet? I often think about the ancient Romans and their indoor plumbing. The height of luxury and technological advance was to have water coming into your own home...delivered by lead pipes. Long before they knew the dangers of lead poisoning, they thought it was the best thing in the world. I sometimes wonder what are we using today that people 100 or 1000 years from now will look back on like we look back on people in our past? Again, science, knowledge, technology, medicine, cannot deliver us from every threat that's out there. But God can.

Still, we don't just pray to God and ask for deliverance. Instead, we also use our brains and we ask God for wisdom and guidance to make good, sensible, decisions. Are they always the right decisions or the best decisions? No, not always. We can look back on our own lives and see that much. Still, God watches over us and directs all things according to His will and His plans, and we can rest assured that He has all things under control, even during a pandemic or a siege.

I'd like to close by saying that we have some great congregational leadership here at Redeemer. During these days of uncertainty and ever changing situations, our elected officers, staff, and Church Council members have been a joy to work with. They've been well informed, sought to take a balanced approach, remained objective, faithful, and full of good humor. They really love our congregation and have sought to make decisions for the best of everyone. God has provided us with them to see us through this time, and God will continue to provide what we need. Stay safe out there, and I look forward to seeing you all again sometime soon.

Coronavirus Update 5/4/2020: Gradual Plan for Reopening Redeemer

Dear members of Redeemer Lutheran Church, on May 1st, 2020, Indiana Governor Eric Holcomb issued Executive Order 20-26 Roadmap to Reopen Indiana. While this order allows religious gatherings in houses of worship as soon as May 8th, Redeemer's leadership has decided on a gradual deliberate opening for Redeemer that includes the following plans:

1. Return to Worship on May 30-31: We will return to regular in-person worship services on May 30-31 (Pentecost Sunday). All three services, Sat. 6:30pm, Sun 8:00am & 10:45am, will offer Holy Communion. We will ask all members to continue to observe social distancing, good hygiene practices, and stay home if you are sick. Those over the age of 65, those at medical risk, and those with concerns are encouraged to remain home according to the CDC guidelines. Online worship services will continue to be provided (pre-recorded or live-streamed). Adult Bible class and Youth Group will meet at their regular Sunday times, however, there will be no Sunday School until further notice. Parents are welcome to bring their children to Bible class with them if they so desire.
2. Open hours for Holy Communion: Pastor Kleinschmidt will be at church on Sundays May 10th, 17th, & 24th from 10:00am to Noon for those who desire to receive Holy Communion in small groups or individually—no appointment will be necessary. Please follow the directions of the elders when you arrive at the East entrance.
3. All Services Holy Communion: Beginning May 30-31 until July 4-5, all in-person worship services will offer Holy Communion, providing our members the greatest opportunity to receive the Sacrament.
4. The Church Office Opens May 26: The church office remains closed until May 26 at which time we will resume normal office hours of 10am – 2pm Mon-Fri.
5. Confirmation Class: Beginning May 19, confirmation class will resume using an online format.
6. Midweek Bible Studies/Lifelight on Hiatus: Midweek Bible studies, including LifeLight remain on break and will be re-examined when Indiana moves to Stage 3 of the Governor's plan (tentatively scheduled for May 24).
7. Vacation Bible School has been cancelled for the summer of 2020.
8. Congregational Assembly Scheduled for September 20: Due to this emergency situation the regular Assembly scheduled for May has been tentatively rescheduled for Sept. 20, 2020 at noon. The election of officers is therefore postponed until that time. Redeemer's Church Council approved the extension of the current officers' terms until a new election can be held – President Kaegebein and Vice President Nieman abstained from the vote.

We know that everyone would love to be back to worship and Bible study as quickly as possible, but we feel that a measured approach to reopening is best. In this way, we can continue to be faithful in our devotion, live as good citizens, and balance our freedom with love for our neighbor's health and wellbeing. This will most likely be a quickly changing situation, and we will try to keep you updated as much as possible. These plans may change. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

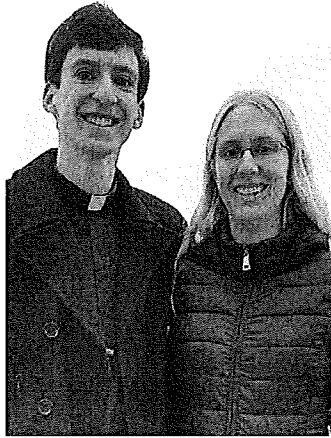

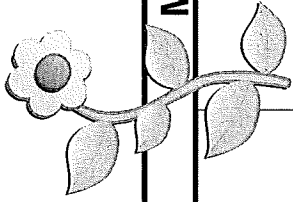


