God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear though the earth gives way, though the mountains be moved into the heart of the sea, though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble at its swelling. — Psalm 46:1-2

What an incredible few months it's been! Not too long ago, COVID-19 was just Wuhan's problem. Now, it's become a months-long pandemic that has affected nearly every aspect of our lives. We've had to make many changes, both in our home lives and in our church. And even now that we're able to come together again, there's a dreaded sense that things will never quite be the same again.

What will the next few months bring? A resurgence of the virus? Maybe. More civil strife? I can't say. If the last few months have taught us anything, it is that we don't know what the future holds. The things that seemed permanent and unchangeable in our lives are actually anything but. They too can be taken away from us.

Psalm 46 speaks to that reality. The earth and the mountains are common symbols in the Psalms of the enduring things of the world. The earth and the mountains, to all appearances, neither move nor change. The image of these durable fixtures collapsing into the sea is one of utter chaos and upheaval of everything we know and count on.

But the Psalm reminds us of where we find refuge in such times. It isn't in the things of this world. It isn't in the creaturely comforts we've come to enjoy. It isn't in having the freedom to go anywhere and do anything. It isn't in political freedoms or in economic stability. All these can be taken away from us at a moment's notice.

God's promises can't be taken away. What Christ said on the cross remains true: "It is finished!" Salvation is purchased for us! Our sins are forgiven! Jesus has prepared a place for us in His Father's kingdom—an inheritance which cannot be snatched away. The last few months haven't changed that. God's love and grace has not wavered. Though it seems the earth has given way, and though it seems the mountains have fallen into the sea, God's promise of grace, mercy, and life everlasting remains true.

The next few months are sure to bring more challenges. We'll all have to adjust to the new normal. We'll have to figure out new skills to continue bringing God's Word to the world. We'll have to deal with inflamed temperaments and compounded stress. It won't be easy. But God remains our refuge and strength, our help in times of trouble. That will be true for the next few months, the next few after that, the next few after those, and even forevermore.

A few service notes, until further notice:

- All three services will be Divine Services, offering Holy Communion through July 5, 2020.
- <u>Hymnals</u> will not be in the pews. Please take one as you enter the sanctuary and return it to the "Used Hymnals" table after service. Take your <u>bulletin</u> home or recycle in the bin under the "Used Hymnals" table.
- Please choose seating next to household members and at least 6 feet away from non-related congregation members.
- Communion tables will include less people. Please allow space between members not from your household and spread out while communing together. *Please do not stand directly next to non-related members.*
- Busy bags will not be available. Please consider bringing your own busy bag of quiet activities for your children during service.
- Since there has been a recent problem with ants, we ask that everyone please refrain from bringing any food or drink into the sanctuary.
 - o If you do bring food, please vacuum your pew and the floor under your pew after service and make sure all wrappers are thrown away. A small hand vac is located in the church kitchen.
- The offering plate will not be passed during service; it will be placed in the Narthex after service.
- Coffee hour will not be offered between Sunday services.

<u>REDEEMER'S WORSHIP SERVICES</u> are now being LIVE STREAMED at 8 a.m. on Sunday. The service will also be saved to YouTube for later viewing.
