*From Pastor's Desk
August-September 2020*

“Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good. ¹⁰ Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. ¹¹ Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. ¹² Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer.”
– Romans 12:9-12

In 1597, the plague struck a small German town where a Lutheran pastor named Philip Nicolai was serving. In just six months the disease would wipe out 1,400 of the town's 2,500 residents. In just a single week, Nicolai buried 170 people. He even remarked that on a single day, they dug 30 graves in his own church cemetery.

It was during those unimaginable times that Philip Nicolai wrote two of our most beloved Lutheran hymns: O Morning Star How Fair and Bright #395 & Wake Awake for Night is Flying #516. Both hymns focus on the return of Christ and the glorious life that awaits people of faith. The hymns proved so popular with German Lutherans that some even memorized the hymns and sang them as part of their family devotions before they went to work in a world infected with the plague. (I'm including them in this newsletter in case you don't have a hymnal at home.)

I'm glad we don't live during those times. But I think we here today are sharing some of the same feelings that those people must have had, and we need the same hope that many of them found through Nicolai's hymns. Of course, it's difficult to rejoice in hope and be patient in tribulation when everyone is frustrated and anxious! As a society, we're learning how to deal with a situation that none of us have been through before, and sometimes our frustration is expended on those who don't deserve it. Our world is short-tempered, accusatory, and in desperate need to find someone to blame. We can get wrapped up in that too.

In response, our God continues to give His greatest gifts to a world that can't seem to look past the problem of the day. God's mercies continue to be new every morning and His promises are just as sure and certain as they ever were. Our lives are a series of ups and downs, our world a cycle of mountains and valleys, one day we feel secure and confident, the next we're wracked with worry and doubt--but our God is calm, steadfast, and secure. That can give us confidence. That can bring us comfort. We can find rest in what God continues to provide.

Here at Redeemer there are comforting things happening. Worship continues online and in-person. Bible study continues, online and in-person. Holy Communion continues in service or by appointment. Baptisms are happening. Weddings are happening. Confirmations are happening. A new vicar is arriving. Prayer continues. Kindness continues. Support for our workers, missionaries, and community continues. There are many things that we can't do or that we're not ready to do, but there are many things that are being done, that are happening, because they revolve around the one thing that does not change: the redemption of Jesus Christ for you.

However this newsletter finds you: anxious or angry, worried or weary, hopeless or hopeful, I want you to know that Jesus has you. His forgiveness and salvation do not depend upon the events of our world—they rest only upon what He finished on the cross for us. God knows the number of our days (Psalm 13), and we are worth more than many sparrows (Matthew 10), therefore let us with all confidence devote ourselves to that which is good: to “rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer.”

A few service notes, until further notice:

- All three services will be Divine Services, offering Holy Communion through September 27, 2020.
- Hymnals: Please take one as you enter the sanctuary and return it to the "Used Hymnals" table after service. Take your bulletin home or recycle in the bin under the "Used Hymnals" table.
- Please choose seating next to household members and at least 6 feet away from non-related members.
- Communion tables include less people. Please allow space between members not from your household and spread out while communing together. *Please do not stand directly next to non-related members.*
- Please do not bring food or drinks into the Sanctuary.
- Busy bags are not available. Please consider bringing your own busy bag of quiet activities for your children during service.
- The offering plate is not being passed during service; it will be placed in the Narthex after service.
- Coffee hour is not being offered between Sunday services.
- Sunday School will not meet until further notice. *Fall plans are being evaluated.* Packets for distance learning will be available September 12-13th, pre-registration required through the church office.

REDEEMER'S WORSHIP SERVICES are being LIVE STREAMED at 8 a.m. on Sunday. The service will also be saved to YouTube for later viewing.

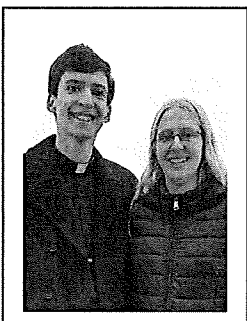

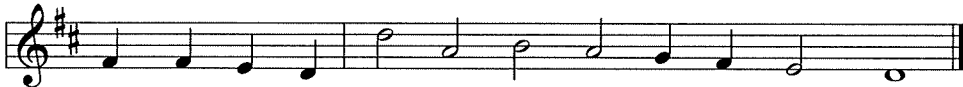

When the Elders called the membership when Covid-19 first struck and Redeemer had to cancel in-person services, many phone numbers were disconnected or no longer belonged to our members.

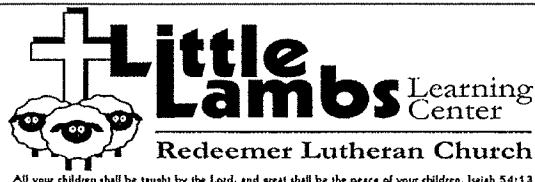
