**Jesus said, "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. The slave does not remain in the house forever; the son remains forever. So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed." John 8:34-36**

The anniversary of the Reformation is upon us once again. We remember Martin Luther nailing his *95 Theses* to the church doors in Wittenberg. We remember his great "Here I Stand" proclamation that still lives in the hearts of Christians today, but we must remember the Reformation is not about Luther. He would not even want us to make it about him. The Reformation is about the message Luther proclaimed and stood for against the false teachings of the Roman Catholic Church.

Luther knew what it meant to be a slave to sin and the devil himself. During his time at the monastery, Luther struggled with his sins because he did not receive the pure Gospel. He thought you had to earn God's grace and favor by doing good works, buying indulgences, making pilgrimages, and the list can go on forever. His worries about where he would spend eternity got the best of him. Then the Holy Spirit showed Luther Romans 1:16-17 which says, "For I am not ashamed of the Gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, 'The righteous shall live by faith.'"

The pure Gospel was presented to him. Luther was set free. He realized it was not his works that would get him into heaven, but his faith in Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior. The same goes for us. The devil will tempt us to think we must do good works in order to get to heaven. He takes our focus off the cross, specifically the One who died on it, and makes us think, "Jesus did His part. Now it's time to do mine." According to Scripture, that's not how it works.

It is not ourselves that set us free from our sins. It is the Son of God Himself who sets us free and has already set us free. How? He shed His blood on the cross for us. That's where we find freedom. The cross of Christ is pure Gospel because there He accomplished salvation for us. The words, "It is finished" mean exactly what I said in the previous sentence. We are free in Christ because of His death and resurrection. We are free to live out the lives God has called us to in order to serve our neighbor and proclaim the same Gospel freedom to them. We are free from the snares of sin, death, and the devil.

There is no greater news than the freedom we have in Jesus Christ. He Himself broke the chains the devil had us in. Our bondage in slavery to sin is over. Christ, the Son of God, brought us through the waters of baptism into His Father's kingdom so we could be His own. We are no longer children of the devil, slaves to his bidding, but children of our heavenly Father who has won us the victory in His Son Jesus Christ. Let us always remember this great promise of redemption in our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

## The Luther Seal: Summary of the Gospel

The most enduring symbol of the Lutheran Reformation is the seal that Luther himself designed to represent his theology. By the early 1520s, this seal begins to appear on the title page of Luther's works.

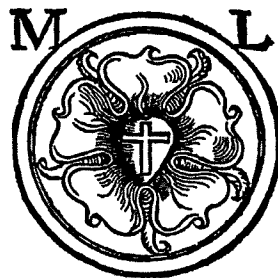
Here is how Luther himself explained its meaning:

*First, there is a black cross in a heart that remains its natural color. This is to remind me that it is faith in the Crucified One that saves us. Anyone who believes from the heart will be justified (Romans 10:10). It is a black cross, which mortifies and causes pain, but it leaves the heart its natural color. It doesn't destroy nature, that is to say, it does not kill us but keeps us alive, for the just shall live by faith in the Crucified One (Romans 1:17). The heart should stand in the middle of a white rose. This is to show that faith gives joy, comfort, and peace—it puts the believer into a white, joyous rose. Faith does not give peace and joy like the world gives (John 14:27). This is why the rose must be white, not red. White is the color of the spirits and angels (cf. Matthew 28:3; John 20:12). This rose should stand in a sky-blue field, symbolizing that a joyful spirit and faith is a beginning of heavenly, future joy, which begins now, but is grasped in hope, not yet fully revealed. Around the field of blue is a golden ring to symbolize that blessedness in heaven lasts forever and has no end. Heavenly blessedness is exquisite, beyond all joy and better than any possessions, just as gold is the most valuable and precious metal.*

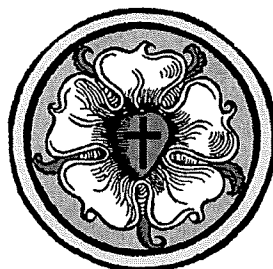

Following are various versions of the seal as it has appeared over time since the Reformation.

The first version was used in Luther's writings in the 1520s for the first time, and was in black and white, with Luther's initials.



A colorized rendition of the seal began appearing as printers began to include color images in Luther's works. Each one was laboriously painted by hand.

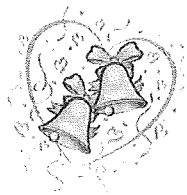


**DON'T FORGET TO FALL BACK ON SATURDAY, OCTOBER 31<sup>ST</sup>!**
