

Christmas Greetings December 2021/January 2022

"For what great nation is there that has a god so near to it as the LORD our God is to us, whenever we call upon him?" – Deuteronomy 4:7

The "near-ness" of the Lord was a unique feature of the true God amongst the false idols of the Canaanites. Even for the later Romans, their gods were far off on the mountain, in the heavens, or beneath the depths. For much of Israel's history, God dwelt nearer to His people than any other deity or nation could claim. For forty years, God traveled with His people in the Tabernacle and Ark of the Covenant, manifesting Himself in the pillar of cloud by day, and the pillar of fire by night, or with the smoke that filled the Holy Place or the Tent of Meeting. Later, when Solomon built the Temple, God attached Himself to a finite location—a building where God's people could seek Him and know that He could be found within its walls. No matter what they were going through, the people of God could know that God saw their plight, heard their prayers, and was never far off in the day of trouble.

Christmas gives us an even better revelation of how near our God is to us. For God once again tabernacled among us, but this time it was not within the walls of tent or temple, but within the very flesh and blood of our own humanity. Jesus came to us and dwelt among us in such near-ness that He was indistinguishable from any other baby born that night in Bethlehem, any other carpenter hailing from Nazareth, any other criminal crucified outside of Jerusalem. As Isaiah said of Him: "he had no form or majesty that we should look at him, and no beauty that we should desire him." (Is. 53:2) Jesus is so truly man that those who trusted their eyes rather than the Scriptures, missed Him. God Himself came to His people, stood right next to them, and almost everybody missed Him except for a few shepherds, some foreign wise men, and then just twelve disciples to start. Even so, God came near to His people.

God is near to you as well. I know we all hoped that the end of this year would see us past so many of the things we struggled with last year, and yet, we're still sort of in the middle of them. God has not left us. God has not left you. He is still near. He still sees your struggles. He still hears your prayers. He is still near to all those who call upon Him in the day (or days) of trouble.

If I could do one thing for every one of our members it would be to make weekly church attendance the absolute, number one priority for all of us. Not because we have such great services, such great singing, or sermons, or Sunday school (we do), but because this is a place where God is still near to His people. Within these walls, our Walls, our God still visits His people. He still dwells with us in very flesh and blood. God is present right here on the corner of Kennedy and 38th street with the people He has called His own, the people He still cares for. Right in this building we encounter Jesus in the Word and Sacraments, week after week, and I don't think you can meet Jesus like that, and not walk away changed for the better. So if I could do one thing for every member, and every family that I know, it would be to see them encounter Jesus every single week because I think it would make such a difference in their lives and in our world. Our God is still near to us and that is an incredible blessing.

"Emmanuel" is Jesus' Christmas name, and it means "God with us" and we are blessed to have Jesus near to us in His Word and through His Sacraments so much so that we don't even have to go a week without Him. Joy to the world, the Lord has come! No matter where you are or what you're dealing with, I hope you know the joy of having the True God who is near to you and who cares for you.

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to one and all.
