From the Vicar's Desk

October/November 2022

"[Jesus said] 'I am with you always, even to the end of the age.' Amen." (Matthew 28:20)

As Autumn comes, we are reminded of life's impermanence. Things change as we prepare for the cold, dark months of winter. The natural world that looked so alive in the warmer months appears to be dying. Green gives way to various hues of reds, browns, and golds as leaves change color and fall to the ground, leaving trees bare. The sun sets a little earlier every day. The warm summer air turns chilly, a reminder that winter is not far away. Between crackling leaves on the sidewalk and weather that makes you reach for a jacket, it is hard to miss the fact that the season is changing.

In the Church, things change too. Traditionally, near the end of the Church Year in November we focus on the Second Coming of our Lord. To many Christians, when Judgment Day will occur is a popular topic to speculate on. So-called prophets make lots of money making predictions about when and how the End will come. Often, the nations of Israel, Iran, or Russia have some special significance in the supposed signs that the "prophet" sees which tell him when Christ will return. Yet Christ Himself tells us that no man knows the day or hour that the world will end (Mt. 24:36). God has not told us when the end will come. When we speculate, we miss the point – that we must be ready for Christ to come back in judgment.

As Christians, we know that we are living in the Last Days. When Jesus Christ came into the world He ushered in a new era for mankind, one in which our sins no longer separate us from God. After Christ rose from the grave, He promised to come back and take His people to be with Him forever, raising us from the grave and giving us new bodies in the New Heaven and New Earth. Even though we wait, God has not abandoned us. We confidently proclaim that He will come back and set all things right. In these last days, He remembers His children and that He takes care of us throughout our lives. We can trust that this will never change. Throughout all seasons, across all years, God is with us and He has promised to never forsake us. Even when the End comes, we will be prepared because our sins are covered by Christ – God has appointed us to obtain salvation through Him (1 Thess. 5:9). We rest secure in this knowledge, even as the circumstances in our lives change. We live waiting for the return of our Lord, praying, Come, Lord Jesus.


