Christmas Greetings December 2022/January 2023

"Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel." – Isaiah 7:14

Throughout the Advent season leading up to Christmas, our Old Testament readings in church all come from the book of Isaiah. No other Old Testament book has more Christmas prophecies than Isaiah, and none of those prophecies are more obvious than the one written above: "the virgin shall conceive and bear a son" and He will be "God with us."

These words from Isaiah go against all our experience and knowledge as human beings. What God promises, doesn't work according to science and biology. Yet, Mary conceived and bore a Son and gave Him the name "Jesus," a name that literally means "God saves." He was also given the title of "Christ," a word which means "chosen one" or "anointed one." So the name Jesus Christ means "by this One, God saves." Just as Isaiah prophesied, our God actually comes to us, dwells with us, and saves us just as He promised. Even though it seems impossible, even though it goes against all human reason, against all the wisdom of science, "the virgin conceived and bore a Son." God does what He says.

This is a great comfort to us. There are many things in our lives that seem unsolvable. There are incurable diseases, situations that don't seem to ever get better, and loved ones that will never come back. All our experience tells us that this is just the way things are. The world around us tells us that there is no God, and if there is, He doesn't care about you, you can't trust what religion tells you, the Bible is just some book like all the rest.

But God does what He says. Isaiah is proof of that. Jesus is proof of that. Not just in His birth at Bethlehem to the Virgin Mary, but also in His death and life again on Easter. "Kill me and three days later I will rise again" Jesus said (Luke 18:33), and He did exactly that—against all reason, all science, all human experience, Jesus did exactly what He said.

God's promises to you are just as sure and certain as the ones contained in the Old Testament and the ones given from our Lord's own mouth. This time of year is filled with joy and hope and merriment for a lot of people, but it can also be a time of loss, sadness, and strife for many more. God's promises remain true through all of it. Your God is with you just as He said. He has known human life for He created it, and then He lived it. Our Lord is not ignorant or distracted from what is happening to us and those we love. He is right here through all of it, for He has promised never to leave us or forsake us (Isaiah 41:10, Matt. 28:20). He has promised that He is in control of all things and is working all things together for our good (Isaiah 55:8-12, Rom. 8:28). Our God is with us just as He said.

We pray for you this Christmas. That you may be of good cheer in whatever your circumstance. That you may meet your struggles with Godly confidence. And that you may know the Lord's presence with you each and every day. If you seek the Lord who comes to be with His people, look first to His own house where Jesus visits us each and every week through the preaching of His Word and the giving of His Divine Supper. Abide with Christ as He abides with you (John 15:4). A blessed Advent preparation and a Merry Christmas to you all.

A Building Fund Option to direct additional gifts directly to Redeemer's East Wing Building Project.

A REDEEMER BUILDING COMMITTEE has been formed to investigate the option of replacing the East Wing of Redeemer with new construction. The current East Wing was built of concrete block in 1961. The water pipes for the East bathrooms, East Wing Boiler, and to the Kitchen/MPR are located in the cement foundation and inside the concrete block walls. Copper pipes which have a typical life span of 50-70 years have been leaking one after another, which currently has left the North Classroom and East bathrooms without heat. At the Congregational Assembly on Sunday, November 20, 2022 it was voted unanimously to work with PBS a local Design-Build company beginning in January/February to complete Project Pre-Construction Planning and Conceptual Design Planning which will give Redeemer the facility assessment; design plans and a project scope with budget development. When the plans are finalized Redeemer will hold a Special Congregational Assembly to review the project plans and cost estimate to vote as to whether or not to move forward with the project. The cost of the Planning phase of the project will be \$23,470. Elizabeth Hecimovich, the Building Committee Chair, is pursuing a grant from the Center for Congregations to cover half of the Planning phase cost. Redeemer will find out mid-January if we receive the grant. Please keep the Building Committee in your prayers as they work to find Redeemer's best solution to this very large problem.

Qualified charitable distributions from your IRA fulfill required minimum distributions

Once you reach age 72, your income could increase as you begin withdrawing money from your IRAs and 401(k). They're called **required minimum distributions**, or RMDs, and they will be **taxable as ordinary income**.

One way to help reduce or eliminate the taxes you might pay on those dollars is called a **<u>qualified</u> <u>charitable distribution, or QCD.</u>** Rather than taking the money as an RMD, you designate a charitable organization to receive the money directly from your IRA.

You must be $70\frac{1}{2}$ to complete a QCD, and only money from a **traditional IRA** can be used, versus your 401(k) or another employer-sponsored plan.

Qualified charitable distributions could be more beneficial than ever since the tax laws changed a few years ago and increased the standard deduction. You may not exceed that standard deduction with your usual annual gifts to charity. So, to get the tax advantage, a QCD might be a good option for you. **Gifts of stock and mutual funds can provide tax-efficiency**

Gifts of stock and mutual funds are a potentially <u>tax-efficient</u> way to support causes you care about. If you own highly appreciated stock or mutual funds, you may face significant capital gains taxes when you sell those securities. You may avoid those tax consequences by giving the securities to a charitable foundation,

Some of those gifts have been specifically directed, but many have been left undirected to be used for the needs of the church.
