From Vicar's Desk October/November 2023

[And] after the earthquake a fire, but the Lord was not in the fire; and after the fire a still small voice. So it was, when Elijah heard it, that he wrapped his face in his mantle and went out and stood in the entrance of the cave. Suddenly a voice came to him, and said, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" -1 Kings 19:12-13

Whenever I find myself in the bookstore, specific genres always draw my attention: travel, history, and coffee table books. Yet, when it comes to the religion and spirituality section, I always leave feeling underwhelmed. This is not because Lutheran authors are often not represented but because the books were mainly concerned with the reader and not with God. Many of these books emphasize some process of renewal to hear the voice of God by praying in a more sincere manner. I often wonder if the people reading these books are sure they would want to hear what the voice of God had to say to them, or would they be taken back?

God has spoken to his people directly before; we call these people prophets. God sent these individuals to give a message, often one of repentance. Take Elijah; he was a prophet sent to Israel, yet Jezebel, the pagan wife of the king, wanted to take his life. So, instead of remaining steadfast and preaching the message God had for Israel, Elijah went into the wilderness to hide. Much like Jonah and the great fish, the word of the Lord will go out, even if its messenger rebels.

So God comes to his prophet who was in the cave, not by a strong wind, earthquake, or fire but in the still small voice with bone-chilling words for Elijah, "What are you doing here?" The still small voice of God is humbling, Earth-shattering, and puts the fear of God into sinners. For the natural disasters beforehand were mere preparations to hear the law in the small voice of God to bring him to repentance. The Lord tells Elijah to return to the way he came so that the words and promises of God may be fulfilled.

Now, the question remains: Do we want to hear the voice of God? Does God uniquely speak to me? God does not leave us alone as orphans but gives us his very word that we may cling to and know him. This word does not need to be individual to us, for the word of the Lord endures forever, not just for a specific time and place. The God who revealed his word to Moses on the two stone tablets continued to bring his people to repentance by the words of the prophets and finally revealed his word by his incarnate Son, Jesus Christ, now uses the still small voice of the church.

When we read the word of God, which is the Holy Scriptures, hear the faithful preaching of that word, and receive the sacraments in faith, we know the voice of our shepherd. For he knows us, and we know him. This is not dependent on whether we have followed the correct steps or listened hard enough, but there is no room for doubt. The voice of God is small in the sense that he uses sinful man, simple water, and ordinary bread and wine, but for us Christians, it is the most powerful voice ever to be heard.


