## From Pastor Kevin McReynolds



The piece of paper that represents the better part of my life between Fall 1987 through Christmas of 1991 hangs in my office on the wall nearest to my head as I write. It is a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of NE in Economics.

I don't often get to use the lessons I learned in those Economics classes apart from when I make cross-application of them. E.g. When demand increases, supply must also increase proportionately in order to meet the demand. It's a general principle of Economics that can translate into other disciplines – even into theology. E.g. the more we sin, the more we need God's grace and forgiveness (see Romans 6:1), OR When more people show up in church on a Sunday, we need more seating to accommodate them. Pretty simple – especially considering this represents much of what I retain after almost 4 years learning. Sheesh!

But there is another lesson from Economics that we learned – one that afflicts us presently in our country: *Inflation*. Inflation can be described as the upward movement of the cost of goods and services in an economy. It's bad for an economy. Especially when the rise in cost of goods or services outpaces the rise in the disposable income people have to purchase those goods or services. (This pretty much describes our current predicament in the US, doesn't it?). For instance, I have been building a little shed to store our outdoor tools in. I'm nearing the end of the project and needed to purchase some pieces of aluminum fascia to finish the outside of the building. I went to the local lumberyard and got a quote and was *stunned* to find out how much this stuff costs – because in my old life in the building materials business, I used to sell it. The cost has almost *quadrupled* since the last time I sold this material back in 2003. 20 years at 4x the price? That works out to an annual average rate of inflation of 7%!

Inflation can be scary – it devalues currency and, when out of control, it can be the archenemy of an otherwise healthy economy. But inflation isn't necessarily all bad. Prices *should* increase over time – proportional to the rate of wage increase. It's only when prices increase, and wages can't keep up (usually due to supply and demand issues) when things get out of hand and inflation occurs and your dollar doesn't go as far as it once did.

Why all this talk about stuff that mostly gets us consumers nervous? Because, as I said: I mostly only get to use my Economics degree when I am borrowing a concept – in this case: Inflation. Specifically, when Inflation is a *good* thing. We have been experiencing inflation here at Redeemer: New members are now a part of the Body of Christ with us. As I write, I'm only moments before a Mission & Ministry Council Meeting where I will report the congregational statistics. This report shows the average age here at Redeemer is dropping (!) Bible Studies, Sunday School, and Confirmation classes are all inflated in size over the same time last year! Giving at the church is outpacing our expenditures! We are experiencing upward movement and expansion in many phases here at Redeemer – *Soli Deo Gloria!* 

(Praise God from whom all blessings flow. Praise Him all creatures here below. Praise Him above ye heavenly host. Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost!).

But inflation can be scary! With younger members, the demand for classes, teachers, programs, and services change. With larger classes, the need for more space is vital. With newer people, the struggle to figure out how to assimilate and include them weighs on us. Maybe you've heard the adage of how we should look at these things not as problems per se, but instead as *opportunities*! The Lord has been good to us – His gifts are many and manifest! How will we respond to these opportunities He has placed before us?

This past Sunday (the twenty-fifth Sunday after Pentecost), the Gospel reading appointed was from Matt. 25:14-30 where Jesus tells a parable about the Kingdom of God. He said it was like a man who went on a journey and entrusted to his servants his property. To each of the different servants, he gave talents – each according to his ability. Upon his return, the man called the servants to account. The faithful servants utilized the talents and made more, whereas the unfaithful servant buried the talent and waited for the master's return. Our role as Christ's Bride, the Church, is not to hide away that which He has given us, but to be always caring for, nurturing, and encouraging further growth of what always was the Master's. How can WE help to inflate (grow) the Harvest? What unique talents, resources, and abilities has God blessed YOU with that could be put to use for your Master? These are questions we MUST ask ourselves if we count ourselves a part of God's Kingdom on earth!

Which brings me back to that paper that hangs by my head on the wall alongside my desk. When I look at some of the other pieces of paper there, they represent ways that I have invested the talents the Lord has bestowed on me – part of which have me here as your Pastor. I don't say this to brag or make over myself, but rather because these pieces of paper are an ever-present reminder to me that whatever I have, however I have put what I have to use... it all flowed first from God's gifts to me.

What will you do with the gifts God has given you? How can you use those gifts in service and love to others as we work together to grow God's Kingdom? Here's a thought: This Christmas, as in Christmases of the past, I want to make you aware of some *other* papers that exist that tell a different story than the ones that hang by my head in my office. There is a file in the church office that contains several vetted organizations that are seeking assistance – either monetary or servant-wise. Some of them are Registered Service Organizations (RSO's) of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod and are working in many and various ways to inflate the Kingdom of God, but they also have many and various needs. I'd like you to consider looking through these files to find some that you might be excited about supporting in lieu of giving a gift. (After all, the supply of our own gifts likely far outweighs our demand for them – if you're anything like me, you live abundantly!) How about donating to or sharing with an individual or an organization that is in need this Christmas? Stop by the office and peruse this file – and if there's nothing there that trips your trigger, but you still are interested in helping, stop in and see me. I'll help connect you to a person or entity who is in need. The work of the Kingdom isn't done until the Master returns – there is still time!





#### **Finance Team Update**

2 Corinthians 9:6 Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver.

Have you ever forgotten the checkbook on a Sunday morning? Misplaced that box of envelopes? Would you like to be more consistent in your giving to church? One way to make giving easier (and thereby making more cheerful givers!) is to donate to church online.

Some of you may not know that we have an online donation system. You can access it on your computer from our website home page or from our Facebook page below each of our YouTube videos. You can setup a single one-time donation or reoccurring donations from your credit/debit card or directly from your checking account by clicking on any of the tiles on that page. Be aware, there is a charge for the convenience of donating this way. For credit/debit card donations there is a flat fee of 45 cents plus 2.84% on the amount of the donation. For a direct bank account donation, the flat fee is 24 cents plus 1% of the amount of the donation. The website has an option for you to increase your donation to cover the charges on your donation but if this is not selected, these expenses are deducted from your donation and the church absorbs the cost of the transaction.

Note that you can make an automated donation without any charges if you use your banks "Bill Payer" service. Banks typically offer this service free of charge just for having an account with them. Within this service, you can set up an autopay on a weekly or monthly reoccurring basis. If you have online access to your bank account, you should be able to set this up yourself from your computer. If you don't have online access, your bank can help set this up for you. You will need the church's address and your envelope number to use as an account number when setting up this service. If you have questions about any of these options or need help in setting up any of these services, please call Mark Troester at 870-421-7065 for assistance.

#### **Restricted Funds Information**

We have a new restricted fund for "Eden Village". Eden Village has broken ground at 1594 Cannie Baker Road. It is a tiny-home community that will provide permanent housing to low income, disabled individuals of the community as soon as next summer. Other active restricted funds include: Food Pantry, Foot Care, Altar Guild, Broadcast Ministries (KTLO), Center of Hope, Organ Replacement/Repair, Redeemer Benevolence Fund, Heart to Heart, Cheer Club, Handbells and Choir. This is not a complete list but covers the ones that are most active and need our support.

#### Message about the Redeemer Benevolence Fund

We occasionally receive donations to the Redeemer Benevolence fund for a specific person. As a refresh reminder about the process, the benevolence fund is administered by our Benevolence Team. ## **Stories behind Our Favorite Hymns**

Our December Hymn of the Month is "Lift Up Your Heads, Ye Mighty Gates". It was written by Georg Weissel (1590-1635), born in Prussia. He was a scholar, a school teacher, a German Lutheran minister and hymn writer. He wrote about 20 hymns. This hymn first appeared in 1642, after Georg had died.

Weissel lived through and died during the Thirty Years War (1618-1648). This was a devastating time as struggles between Protestant princes of Bohemia and the Catholic Emperor lead to plundering and the untold suffering that brought disease and famine. During this time the population of Germany dwindled from 16 million to 6 million in 30 years.

Pastor Weissel was inspired by Psalm 24 to write this hymn. David was calling the people of Jerusalem to prepare for the Ark of the Covenant coming into the city. The Ark represented the presence of the Lord. David called for the people to open the gates so the Lord could enter.

In like manner, this hymn calls us to open the gates of our hearts so the Lord can enter there. It calls us to make our heart a temple, fit for the Lord. The first verse is our waiting for the "King of Glory" who is the "Savior of the World" (see Psalm 24:7-10). In verse two we see the times full of "distress" and "woe". Verse four reminds us that the gates are the "portals of [our] hearts". Our heart becomes a "temple set apart from earthly use for heaven's employ". In verse five, we see the "King" has become a "Redeemer" who will abide in our wide-open hearts. The petition is to the Holy Spirit to "lead us on until the glorious race is won" (i.e. lead us to eternity).

During Advent, we wait for a Savior who will not only change our hearts now, but will come in glory in the fulfillment of time.

Psalm 24:7 "Lift up your heads, O gates! And be lifted up, O ancient doors, that the King of glory may come in."

devotion not only address a question, but will get children thinking about something they can say (a Bible verse), do and pray about.

Advent is a time of preparation, a time to focus on our need for a Savior and on God's response to that need by sending His very own Son to be our Savior.

The devotional is easy enough for older children to read on their own and for younger children to understand. Paired with an advent wreath (lighting candles), hymns and setting up a nativity, this devotional can provide hope and comfort in Jesus.

This book can become a yearly Advent tradition and will hopefully spark devotion time in families year-round.




#### Odyssey Children's Sunday School


## Bible STUDY Join us!
