Still, our heavenly Father is merciful, and He invites us to draw near to His throne in confidence to ask for forgiveness.

P: Heavenly Father,

C: though I am Your chosen child, I have acted in accordance with the world rather than Your Word. I have proclaimed hatred and violence rather than Your excellencies. Forgive me, renew me, and restore me as Your newborn, chosen, priestly child, on account of Jesus. Amen.

P: Though Jesus was rejected and killed, God raised Him from the dead, and for His sake forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of Jesus and by His authority, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the

Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen. I am forgiven. I am a newborn, chosen, priestly child of God.

P: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

P: Together, we pray,

C: Jesus, You are the cornerstone and foundation upon which Your Church is built. Tear down all that we have built that was built apart from You, and secure us upon Yourself, our Rock and our Redeemer, for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever, Amen.
