L: In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. John 1:1

P: Word. What kind of name is that? Moses asks God, "What is Your name?" and God thunders back with the foundation stone of all language, namely "I AM". Truly an affirmation of the beginning of all reality, that God truly IS! And perhaps also an insight into God's nature. God is the Author of Life. And now "I AM" introduces to us His only Son. There are so many names for God in the Bible, but this one, "Word" is among the unexpected. Or is it? God, in His love, has chosen, not to be remote, unknown, and out of touch, but close, familiar, and in constant communication.

+...Dwell In You Richly...+

L: Now it's God who makes both us and you stand firm in Christ. He anointed us, set His seal of ownership on us, and put His Spirit in our hearts as a deposit, guaranteeing what is to come. 2 Corinthians 1:21-22

P: The Holy Spirit has dug Himself into the hard rock of our hearts and created a new thing, a strong faith, and filled it with treasures and light where there was once darkness.

#496, Holy Spirit, Light Divine

(Women)1. Holy Spirit, light divine, Shine upon this heart of mine; Chase the shades of night away, Turn the darkness into day.

- (<u>All</u>) 2. Let me see my Savior's face, Let me all His beauties trace; Show those glorious truths to me, Which are only known to Thee.

- L: Let us therefore make every effort to do what leads to peace and to mutual edification. Romans 14:19
- P: Everyone's a teacher. The parent shows a child how to communicate. The child teaches a parent how to trust. Your presence here teaches your neighbor the importance of God. Everyone is a teacher by default, but the Christian is commissioned to be a teacher by design.

#696, O God, My Faithful God

(<u>Women</u>) 1. O God, my faithful God, True fountain ever flowing, Without whom nothing is, All perfect gifts bestowing: Give me a healthy frame, And may I have within, A conscience free from blame, A soul unstained by sin.

- (Men) 2. Grant me the strength to do, With ready heart and willing, Whatever You command, My calling here fulfilling; That I do what I should, While trusting You to bless, The outcome for my good, For You must give success.

L: The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom; all who follow His precepts have good understanding. To Him belongs eternal praise.

Psalm 111:10

P: Everyone has an idea what wisdom is, but not everyone is wise. It's difficult to define wisdom. Knowing what to do? That's knowledge. Knowing what is? That's truth. Having a proper attitude? That's perception. Being right? That's often perception, too. But what's wisdom? To be wise is to know reality and to accommodate yourself to it. So first, know the reality. God, His creation, His law, and His love are real.

#732, All Depends on Our Possessing

- (<u>All</u>) 1. All depends on our possessing, God's abundant grace and blessing, Though all earthly wealth depart. They who trust with faith unshaken, By their God are not forsaken, And will keep a dauntless heart.
- (<u>Choir</u>) 3. Many spend their lives in fretting, Over trifles and in getting, Things that have no solid ground. I shall strive to win a treasure, That will bring me lasting pleasure, And that now is seldom found.

+...In Psalms...+

L: The crowd joined in the attack against Paul and Silas, and the magistrates ordered them to be stripped and beaten. After they had been severely flogged, they were thrown into prison, and the jailer was commanded to guard them carefully. Upon receiving such orders, he put them in the inner cell and fastened their feet in the stocks. About midnight, Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them. Acts 16:22-25

+...Hymns...+

L: "I will extol the Lord at all times; His praise will always be on my lips. My soul will boast in the Lord; let the afflicted hear and rejoice. Glorify the Lord with me; let us exalt His name together." Psalm 34:1-3

P: One of the greatest hymn writers was Paul Gerhardt, a 17th century German Pastor. In one of his hymns, "Evening and Morning", he writes about singing to God: To God in heaven, all praise be given! Come, let us offer and gladly give, to the Creator the gifts He will prize, gladly receiving our fruits of believing. Hymns that adore Him are precious before Him, and to His throne like sweet incense arise.

#790, Praise To The Lord the Almighty

(<u>All</u>) 1. Praise to the Lord, the Almighty, the King of creation! O my soul, praise Him, for He is your health and salvation! Let all who hear, Now to His temple draw near, Joining in glad adoration!

(<u>Women</u>) 2. Praise to the Lord, who o'er all things is wondrously reigning, And, as on wings of an eagle, uplifting, sustaining. Have you not seen, All that is needful has been, Sent by His gracious ordaining?

P: Why the distinction: psalms, hymns, Spiritual songs? Psalms, of course, are set apart from hymns because they are taken directly from Holy Scripture, whereas hymns and Spiritual songs are not.

L: Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. 1 Thessalonians 5:18

P: Is joy the absence of sorrow? Is peace the absence of war? Is health the absence of illness? These questions are an attempt to define. But there's a greater depth to a word than mere definition. Application is greater. One might ask, how can there be joy in the presence of sorrow? How can one find peace, even in war? Can health be found in spite of illness? Can gratitude blossom in the most meager of blessings?

Fanny Crosby, author, poet, and hymn writer of the 19th century is the author of many well-known and beloved hymns. Many people don't know or remember that she was blind. She wrote: *O what a happy soul am I, although I cannot see. I am resolved that in this life, contented I will be. How many pleasures I enjoy, that other people don't. To weep and sigh because I'm blind, I cannot, and I will not.*

P: Te Deum, is a Latin title familiar to many. Te Deum Laudamus, translates "We Praise You, O God." Colossians 3:16, the theme of our Reformation Hymn Fest, may not be the official inspiration for this ancient song of the Church, but it does conclude with the words, "Te deum", to God. The "Te Deum", having taken its place in the Order of Matins, has been set to music time and again. There are probably more "Te Deum's" written than any other hymn of the Church, except perhaps for the Magnificat. Every hymn is a "Te Deum" in that it is sung to God. And while our renditions today of the hymns might be glorious and praiseworthy, the glory and praise expressed here are indeed to God. May every hymn be a "Te Deum." May every song we sing be worthy of the title, "Te Deum." May every day be a "Te Deum." May every deed, every thought, every goal, and every one be a "Te Deum." We rise and sing...
