
Sunday, December 17, 2023, 11:15am Third Sunday In Advent Bright Light of Bethlehem... A Special Purpose Light



Advent means 'coming'.

This sacred Season is for the purpose of Jesus coming to us and coming for us.

As we count down the days until Christmas, our hearts are getting ready to celebrate Jesus' initial arrival, His first advent, when He entered into our world as the Babe of Bethlehem.

At the same time, we prepare our hearts for His second advent, His final coming, when He will return to earth to judge both the living and the dead and to give eternal life to all who believe in Him.

Our Readings for today remind us of the special ministry of John the Baptist, who came as a witness to Jesus, the light of the world. John was not the light, nor was he the centerpiece of God's plan to save the world. No, John's life was dedicated to preparing the way before the Lord and to get people ready for Jesus coming to save us.

In many ways, we are invited to be like John...to trust in Jesus, our Savior and King, and then let the world know He is coming to the rescue of His people.

You, I have kept silent and withheld Your grace from others. For the sake of my Savior and King, have mercy on me. Forgive me and restore me. Guide me and renew me. Help me to walk in Your ways to the glory of Your Holy name. Amen.

P: Now may the God of peace Himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit and soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus. He who calls you is faithful; He will surely do it. Our faithful God hears our prayers and answers them, removing our sins from us and declaring us blameless in His sight through faith in Jesus. As a called and ordained servant of Jesus, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

P: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

P: Together, we pray,

C: Lord Jesus Christ, we implore You to hear our prayers. Strengthen our witness to the true light that overcomes our darkness; for You live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever, Amen.

And I believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church, I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins, and I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.
