Opening Song of Praise

P: We are called to confess our sins, trusting in God who is faithful and just and who will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

P: Though Jonah was reluctant when God spoke to him the first time, He spoke to Jonah a second time and told him, go to Nineveh, that great city, and call out against it the message that I tell you.

P: Jesus called to Simon and Andrew, Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men. Immediately they dropped their nets and followed Him.

C: As You, O Lord, have called me to follow You, I have instead sinned against You in thought, word, and deed, by what I have done and by what I have left undone. For this I seek Your forgiveness.

P: Even to the evil Ninevites, God showed His mercy upon their repentance. Though we deserve His present and eternal punishment, God has relented by sending Jesus to bear our sin and to be our Savior. Jesus has taken our punishment, paid the price of our sins through His perfect life and sacrificial death, and for His sake forgives us all our sins. As a called and ordained servant of the Word, I announce the grace of God to all of you. In the stead and by the command of Jesus, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

P: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

P: Together, we pray.

C: Gracious God, though not deserved, You continue to call us Your children. Though not deserved, You showed mercy and continue to show mercy to us. Continue to grant us the gift of a bold and confident faith in You, through Jesus

Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

The Sermon Our Nineveh

P: Please rise and join me as we profess our faith,
