
Sunday, February 4, 2024, 11:15am Who Are You? Fifth Sunday after Epiphany



To say people have 'an epiphany' usually means that they have come, not only to see something new, but to see something that was already there but in a new or different way.

In the Season of Epiphany, we rejoice in the newness that is Jesus shining in the darkness and making Himself known to sinners.

But more than that, the Epiphany of Jesus, who He is and for whom He is, has us 'having epiphanies' as we come to see things that were already there in new or different ways.

Silence for reflection.

P: Almighty God, we poor sinners confess to You that we are by nature sinful and unclean and that we have sinned against You in thought, word, and deed. We flee for refuge to Your mercy, seeking and imploring Your grace for the sake of our Lord Jesus.

C: O most merciful God, who has given Your only-begotten Son to die for me, have mercy upon me and for His sake grant me remission of all my sins; and by Your Holy Spirit increase in me true knowledge of You and of Your will and true obedience to Your Word, to the end that by Your grace I may come to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ, my Lord. Amen.

P: Almighty God has had mercy upon you and has given His only Son to die for you and for His sake forgives you all your sins. In the stead and by the command of Jesus, I, a called and ordained servant of the Word, forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. He who began this good work within you will bring it to completion on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ.

C: Amen.

P: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

P: Together, we pray.

C: Merciful Lord, You have granted us a new identity and life in Jesus. Keep us, we pray, in this faith and life in Jesus that we may know with confidence we belong to You and live secure in this knowledge both now and forevermore; through Jesus Christ, our Lord, whom with You and the Holy Spirit, are one God, one Lord, now and forever. Amen.

The Sermon Who Are You?

P: We profess our faith,

C: I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.
