Children's Time

Genesis 15:1-6

After these things the word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision, Fear not, Abram, I am your shield, your reward shall be very great. But Abram said, O Lord God, what will You give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus? And Abram said, Behold, You have given me no offspring, and a member of my

household will be my heir. And behold, the word of the Lord came to him, This man shall not be your heir, your very own son shall be your heir. Hebrews 11:1-16

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. For by it the people of old received their commendation. By faith we understand that the universe was created by the word of God, so that what is seen was not made out of things that are visible. By faith Abel offered to God a more acceptable sacrifice than Cain, through which he was commended as righteous, God commending him by accepting his gifts. And through his faith, though he died, he still speaks. By faith Enoch was taken up so that he should not see death, and he was not found, because God had taken him. Now before he was taken he was commended as having pleased God. And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him. By faith Noah, being warned by God concerning events as yet unseen, in reverent fear constructed an ark for the saving of his household. By this he condemned the world and became an heir of the righteousness that comes by faith. By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to a place that he was to receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he went to live in the land of promise, as in a foreign land, living in tents with Isaac and Jacob, heirs with him of the same promise. For he was looking forward to the city that has foundations, whose designer and builder is God. By faith Sarah herself received power to conceive, even when she was past the age, since she considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one man, and him as good as dead, were born descendants as many as the stars of heaven and as many as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore. These all died in faith, not having received the things promised, but having seen them and greeted them from afar, and having

acknowledged that they were strangers and exiles on the earth. For people who speak thus make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of that land from which they had gone out, they would have had opportunity to return. But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared for them a city. This is the Word of the Lord.

P: There are just 4 hymns in our Lutheran Service Book that include the word summer in their texts. It's fitting, as the summer season draws to its close, to sing through each of these hymns. We will be singing one of each week for the remaining 4 weeks in August as we travel through the Season of Pentecost. The earliest written of the 4 summer songs is **Oh**, **That I Had a Thousand Voices**, which appeared in a German Lutheran hymnal in 1704. The hymn was originally written in 15 verses by Pastor Johann Mentzer, who lived from 1658 to 1734 and served Lutheran congregations in eastern Germany. Pastor Mentzer had a full perspective of God's creation and in this hymn exults, *You forest leaves so green and tender that dance for joy in summer air....You live to show God's praise alone. Join me to make His glory known*. Our hymn of praise may have just our own voice rather than a thousand, but its object of worship remains the same, our faithful God, who delights in our praises!
