Bible Study is in the Fireside Room

Johann Casper Ferdinand Fischer 1656-1746 was a German Baroque composer regarded as one of the best composers for keyboard of his day. Heavily influenced by the French Baroque style, Fischer was responsible for bringing the French influence to German music. However, partly due to the rarity of surviving copies of his music, his compositions are rarely heard today. Today's prelude is a piece from Fischer's Blumen-Strauss (tr: Musical Bouquet), a compilation of eight preludes each composed in a different tone, followed by brief fugues and a finale.

Nikolai Grundtvig (1783-1872), a Danish historian, wrote the words "Built On A Rock" in 1837. The 18th century period of Enlightenment brought a rationalism that removed God from daily life; when the 19th century saw a falling away from Enlightenment, Grundtvig was dismayed to see the thought not turning in the direction of God. Grundtvig pointed out that the church was alive and well, because it is built on a Rock, "For no one can lay a foundation other than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ." (1 Corinthians 3:11). Throughout the original seven verses of this hymn, Grundtvig points out the strength of the foundation upon which the Church is built. The tune for this hymn, KIRK was penned by Ludvig M. Lindeman (1812-1887), a prominent Norwegian musician of the time. In this tune Lindeman utilized the Dorian mode - a close cousin to the minor scale - a common scale used in European-based folk music of the time.

Johann Pachelbel (1653-1695) was a German organist and composer who also taught organ. One of his pupils was Johann Christoph Bach, who in turn gave his younger brother Johann Sebastian Bach his first formal keyboard lessons. Although his most famous work is the Canon in D, Pachelbel also contributed to the development of the chorale prelude and fugue. A Toccata and Fugue composed by Pachelbel are our postlude today.
