

Today's Old Testament reading, from Exodus chapter 3 begins the narrative on the movement of the nation of Israel from bondage under the Egyptians to freedom. A repeated refrain found in the following chapters is "Let my people go!". This theme became the basis for a song three millennia later, first published in sheet music form in December 1861 as "The Song of the Contrabands". Reverend L.C. Lockwood, a chaplain for escaped slaves fighting with the Union Army, published this song after hearing them sing it after

their arrival at Fort Monroe, Virginia. In that original publication Lockwood noted that "this song has been sung for about nine years by the slaves of Virginia." This morning's prelude (8:00) is a setting of this spiritual by Bradley Sowash (b. 1960) which, although it may fall slightly outside the usual German Lutheran tradition, follows our Old Testament reading. Sowash describes the arrangement as "including some wandering, open-ended sections... to represent those wandering years in the desert, before returning to the catchy theme."

Altar Flowers - Did you know that the altar flowers are paid for totally by member donations? If nobody signs up on a Sunday someone on the Altar Guild usually ends up covering the cost.
