Reflect:

Jesus is gone, because the last time he was near Jerusalem they tried to stone him to death. How do you hear the statements of Mary and Martha that if he had been there, their brother wouldn't have died?

Jesus proclaims that He is the resurrection and the life – not just for the last day, but for *this* day. How is the resurrection happening in this day in your life? What is dying, and being born anew?

Respond:

Jesus is incredibly disruptive to the world as it was. How do you respond to disruptions?
