June 13, 2021 Third Sunday after Pentecost

Joachim Neander (1650-1680) wrote approximately sixty hymns, with "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty" being his best known. It was written in the last year of his short life. Seven years earlier, Neander had met Phillipp Jakob Spener, the founder of German Pietism, and this relationship shaped Neander and his hymns. He has been called the "first poet of the Reformed Church in Germany" and the "Paul Gerhardt of the German Calvinists."

The hymn "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty", which we will sing today, is one of the Church's most beloved hymns of praise, building to the final phrase "let the Amen" in the final stanza. The tune LOBE DEN HERREN, whose composer is unknown, was first published in 1665, but most likely dates back to much earlier than that.
