

## May 21, 2023 Seventh Sunday of Easter



In its earliest publication in 1851, Matthew Bridges (1800-94) preceded the hymn "Crown Him with Many Crowns" with the heading "In capite ejus, diademata multa" ("On his head were many crowns"). This was three years after his conversion from the Church of England to Roman Catholicism, a religion he had strongly critiqued as a younger man. In the 1870s, some objections were raised to the text, probably due to imagery included in the hymn, however specifically what those objections are has been lost to time. In response, Godfrey Thring (1823-1903) wrote a modified version, which was published in 1874 under the title "Crown Him with crowns of gold.", This

version included the footnote "The greater part of this hymn was originally written at the request of the Rev. H. W. Hutton, to supply the place of some of the stanzas in Matthew Bridge's well-known hymn, of which he and others did not approve; it was afterwards thought better to rewrite the whole, so that the two hymns might be kept entirely distinct." LSB, like most hymnals, uses a composite of these two versions with stanzas 1 through 3 by Bridges and stanzas 4 and 5 by Thring.

Another version was written by Percy Dearmer (1867-1936), who added a social dimension, His first stanza began "Crown Him upon the throne of justice and of right." Our previous hymnal, Lutheran Worship, used the same text as LSB, but also included an additional stanza by Bridges beginning "Crown him the Lord of years, the potentate of time," which is actually a combination of parts of two original stanzas.

The tune, DIADEMATA, which is derived from Latin for "crowns', was penned by George J. Elvey (1816-1893) for this hymn.
