# June 11, 2023 Second Sunday after Pentecost



From the Organist The text of the hymn "God of Grace and God of Glory", written by the noted New York City pastor Harry Emerson Fosdick (1878-1969) was first sung on October 5, 1930, at the opening service of the newly built Riverside Church in the Morningside Heights section of the city. Written the previous summer while the author vacationed at Boothbay Harbor, Maine, the hymn was featured again at the dedication of the Riverside Church on February 8, 1931. In his autobiography, *The Living of These Days* (a line taken from the hymn itself), Fosdick recalls, "That was more than a hymn to me when we sang it that day - it was a very urgent personal prayer. For with all my hopeful enthusiasm about the new venture there was inevitably much humble and sometimes fearful apprehension."

The author intended the hymn to be sung to the tune REGENT SQUARE; it appeared with that familiar melody in a 1932 publication. In subsequent decades it has become more frequently paired with the solid Welsh melody CWM RHONDDA, as we find in our hymnal today. The version we sing today omits the original fourth stanza:

Set our feet on lofty places;

Gird our lives that they may be

Armored with all Christlike graces

In the fight to set men free.

Grant us wisdom, Grant us courage,

That we fail not man nor thee!

Congregational Survey Update - As we continue to struggle to get people to serve in leadership positions a committee was formed to make recommendations for a new governing structure. The first step to accomplish this was to get input from the congregation to clarify a direction or vision for St. Stephanus. In May a survey was conducted. The results have been gathered and are being reviewed and tabulated. A summary will be made available to the congregation once the review has been completed. Our goal is to have this information available in early July.

Governance Committee Update - The Governance Committee is currently reviewing the congregational survey data. In addition, we are evaluating alternative governance structures and changes to guide and lead St. Stephanus. One of our key resources is the book "Governance and Ministry, Rethinking Board Leadership" by Dan Hotchkiss. We are finding the book helpful in directing our conversations.
