August 13, 2023 Eleventh Sunday after Pentecost



William Whiting (1825-78) penned the hymn "O Thou Who bidd'st the ocean deep" in 1860, then republished in 1861 with the first line we know today, "Eternal Father, Strong to Save." Known throughout the world as the "sailors' hymn," it may have been written for a student of Whiting's who was about to sail to the United States. Its opening lines are inscribed over the chancel of the chapel at the U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis. In the 1861 publication, it was set to the tune MELITA, specif-

ically composed for it by one of England's best-known church musicians of the nineteenth century, John Bacchus Dykes (1823-76).

The hymn caught the English-speaking world by storm, as it were, first appearing in America in an 1864 publication. The present version is taken from a 1937 version, with the second and third stanzas added at that time, although the original second and third stanzas are also printed in our hymnal as alternates.

The original publication was prefaced with words from Psalm 107:24, "These men see the works of the Lord, and His wonders in the deep." The preceding Psalm verse depicts a busy commercial environment, "Some went down to the sea in ships, doing business on the great waters," and the following verses (25-30) bring home the dangers inherent in such an enterprise. The first three stanzas are each addressed to a different member of the Trinity, and stanza 4 praises the whole Trinity with "glad praise from air and land and sea" - the triune God is worthy of praise for the protection He bestows and the salvation He brings.
