October 1, 2023 Eighteenth Sunday after Pentecost



Frances Ridley Havergal, the author of the hymn "Take My Life and Let

It Be," recounts the event that led to its writing: "There were ten persons in the house, some unconverted and long prayed for, some converted but not rejoicing Christians. He gave me the prayer, "Lord give me all in this house!" And he just did! Before I left the house every one had got a blessing. The last night of my visit I was too happy to sleep, and passed most of the night in praise and renewal of my own consecration, and these little couplets formed themselves and chimed in my heart one after another, till they finished with, "Ever, ONLY, ALL for Thee!" This refers to a visit Havergal paid to Areley House in Worcestershire, England, which was at that time a resort and now a care home for people with dementia.. Havergal was known for her capabilities as linguist, musician poet, and an intense

commitment to God which she fervently shared. Stanza 4 brings to mind the story of the widow's mite found in Luke 21, and the example of the early Church, many members of which sold their possessions to distribute to those in need. It emphasizes the Christian's perspective that all we own belongs to God, and we offer it to His use (! Timothy 6:6-10), making it a fitting hymn for this Stewardship Sunday.

On September 24th, the St. Stephanus Voter's Assembly extended a Divine Call to Yohannes Ghebru to serve as Missionary Pastor at St. Stephanus Lutheran Church. The process for calling someone from the Seminary is slightly different than calling a Pastor from another congregation. The Call Documents are now forwarded to the District President of the Minnesota South District of The Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, who will then forward the documents to Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, MO and the Cross-Cultural Ministry Center in Irvine, CA. Pending the successful completion of all academic programs and vicarage requirements that they have, Vicar Yohannes will then be able to formally make a decision on accepting or returning (declining) the call. I would anticipate this happening once this academic term ends in December. If all goes well, we would be looking at hosting an Ordination Service as early as late December or early January. We will keep you informed if anything changes and when that service will be, and give glory to God for God's work here at St. Stephanus.

Who are the "Left Behind" Children is China? How will they benefit from the October 15th Bake Sale?

The children of migrant laborers in China are frequently left behind at home while their parents move to other cities or provinces for work. These "left-behind children" in China total more than 70 million and struggle with the problems caused by the absence of one or both parents. In many rural communities, the percentage of left-behind children is over 50%, and can be even as high as 70-80%. The absence of one or both parents substantially worsens children's psychological development, emotional well-being, social functioning, and school performance.
