Nov. 5, 2023 All Saints Sunday



William Walsham How (1823-97) was ever mindful of the communion of saints on earth and in the Church Triumphant. His colleague William Boyd Carpenter, bishop of Ripon, wrote, "He felt the fervor of catholic life; the great host of Gods serving, struggling, martyred, yet triumphant children passed before his view; he saw the glorious procession of the sons of God as they swept through the open gates of Paradise; he heard their victorious song of praise; the Alleluia of the redeemed rang in his ears and passed

into music in his noble hymn for All Saints' Day."

This noble hymn, "For All the Saints", was written while How was rector at Whittington, a farming village on the border between England and Wales. It became popular within his lifetime and remains the most widely known hymn of his sixty publications.

The original stanzas 3, 4, and 5, reflecting part of the Te Deum, were often omitted in subsequent hymnals, reducing the number of stanzas from the original eleven to the eight found in our hymnal today.

The tune, SINE NOMINE, is Latin for "without a name", which may refer to the unnamed saints that are the subject of the hymn, but some speculate that it may be the composer's whimsical poke at the convention of naming hymn tunes. Ralph Vaughan Williams (1872-1958), the English composer and musical editor of *The English Hymnal with Tunes* in which the words were first set to the tune we use today, composed two harmonizations of the tune, as it appears in our hymnal. Ralph Vaughan Williams was a close friend and mentor of **Herbert Howells** (1892-1983), another English composer of church music, composing several pieces for the Anglican liturgy, although his career as organist was brief due to ill health. Among Howell's compositions is the "Preludio 'Sine nomine'", written in 1940, and the first of a set of "Six Pieces" dedicated to a fellow organist.


