Nov. 26, 2023 Last Sunday of the Church Year

Matthew Bridges (1800-1894), like several others of his era, started in the Anglican Church and then, although he had strongly critiqued Roman Catholicism as a younger man, became a Roman Catholic. This was during the time of the Oxford Movement in England, which centered on the claim that the Anglican Church had a lineal descent from the original Apostolic Church. Followers of this movement studied the ancient history of the church, its doctrine, and especially its liturgy, discovering a wealth of Greek and Latin hymnody from the earliest centuries of the Christian church. Several people focused on translating the Greek and Latin hymns, while other former Anglican poets, including Bridges, began writing original hymns for use in the Roman Catholic church.

Matthew Bridges penned the words to the hymn "Crown Him with Many Crowns", first publishing it in 1851 under the heading "In capite ejus, diademata multa" ("His eyes are like blazing fire, and on his head are many crowns. He has a name written on him that no one knows but he himself"), Revelations 19:12 (NIV) The original six stanzas as written by Bridges mention six crowns. In the 1870s, some objections were raised to the text, specifically because of Bridges' references to the Virgin mary, and as a response Godfrey Thring (1823-1903), an Anglican Priest, wrote a modified version published in 1874 under the title "Crown Him with crowns of gold." Our hymnal, like most current hymnals, uses a composite of the two versions using stanzas 1 through 3 by Bridges and stanzas 4 and 5 by Thring.

Every good hymn needs a stirring tune, and Sir George Job Elvy (1816-1893) was up to to the task when he composed the tune DIADEMATA, meaning "crowns", which was first published to accompany these words in 1868 when the hymn was first introduced into an Anglican hymnal. Elvy served the royal family as organist, choirmaster, and composer for St. George's Chapel from 1835 to 1882, appropriately being a royal musician composing a coronation tune.

In 1925 Pope Pius XI established the Feast of Christ the King, to be celebrated on the last Sunday in the Church year, to remind Christians that their allegiance was to their ruler in heaven as opposed to earthly supremacy, opposing a claim by Benito Mussolini. Since then, the Lutheran Church, Anglicans, Presbyterians and Methodists all have added this day to their lectionary, and the fitting hymn "Crown Him with Many Crowns" will be sung as our opening hymn today, with a setting also serving as the postlude.
