Dec. 3, 2023 First Sunday of Advent

Ambrose of Milan (340-397) created the hymn Veni Redemptor Gentium in the 4th century, at around the same time as the date of Christmas was first fixed by the Church. The second stanza of this hymn translates to "Redeemer of the gentiles, come", and these lyrics were adapted by Martin Luther in 1524 into the German hymn Nun komm der Heiden Heiland, ("Now come, Savior of the heathens"). Luther's publication was edited by the composer Johann Walter, who is given credit for the tune, which derived from the original's plainchant melody. Traditionally used for the first Sunday of Advent, this hymn is the basis of multiple cantatas as well as several chorales.
