


#### Ash Wednesday Worship

There will be a service at St. Stephanus on the night of Ash Wednesday (February 14<sup>th</sup>) at 7 PM as we reflect on our life in Christ and gratefulness for His forgiveness and mercy. We will not have services on the other weeks of Lent at St. Stephanus. We will have services again at St. Stephanus during Holy Week on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday.

Having passed through the season of waiting (Advent), birth (Christmas) and revelation of Christ (Epiphany), today we celebrate the Feast of Transfiguration, the last day of the season of Epiphany.

Henry V became King of England in 1413 and was known as a decisive and capable ruler. The English kings had originally been French nobles, and France was under a period of weak kings, so Henry decided that the time was right to reestablish the English monarchy's influence in France. In 1415 he raised an army, pawning some of the crown

jewels for funding, and invaded France, resulting in a decisive victory at Agincourt on October 25 of that year. In celebration of the victory a composition was written with English verses with a refrain in Latin. This refrain, "Deo gratias anglia, redde pro victoria" ("Give thanks to God, England, for the victory") went on to celebrate the king's march into France, winning victories, and proceeding throughout France to the victory at Agincourt. This might have been sung on the triumphant return of the king to London, although records of the time note that the king would not "suffer any ditties to be made and sun by minstrels of his glorious victory, for that he would wholly have the praise and thanks altogether given to God." Our Hymn of the Day, "O Wondrous Type! O Vision Fair" is set to this tune, DEO GRACIAS, which is also known as AGINCOURT HYMN.

The closing hymn this morning, "Alleluia, Song of Gladness" originates from a hymn first found in 11th century manuscripts ("Alleluia dulce carmen"). The Lutheran Service Book notes "we are mourning exiles who long to be in the heavenly Jerusalem, here referred to as 'joyful mother." This hymn fittingly is used on the Sunday before Ash Wednesday, as we "put away" the Alleluia until the celebration of Easter.

# **Documentary: Food Chains**

# February 11

Plan to watch this award-winning documentary following worship. Snacks will be provided, and a discussion will follow. Suggested age is 13 years and older.

In America, farm labor has always been one of the most difficult, poorly paid jobs and has relied on some of the nation's most vulnerable people. While the legal restrictions that keep people bound to farms have been abolished, exploitation still exists. Ranging from wage theft to modern-day slavery, this exploitation is perpetuated by the corporations at the top of the food chain.

"Food Chains" reveals the human cost in our food supply and the complicity of large buyers of produce like fast food and supermarkets. Supermarkets earn \$4 trillion globally and have tremendous power over the agricultural system. Over the past 3 decades they have drained revenue from their supply chain leaving farm workers in poverty and forced to work under subhuman conditions.

The narrative of the film focuses on an intrepid and highly lauded group of tomato pickers from Southern Florida—the Coalition of Immokalee Workers or CIW — who are revolutionizing farm labor. Their story is one of hope and promise for the triumph of morality over corporate greed — to ensure a dignified life for farm workers and a more humane, transparent food chain.
