

Thy kingdom come...

There is a quote that is said once in each of the Star Wars films, "I've got a bad feeling about this." As the events in our country have unfolded over the past few months and the election season is well under way, I find myself quoting that famous line all too often. The events of this year have more than any other in my short 45-year life span, have divided our country so greatly. Throughout our past politics have always divided us on issues we did not agree on. But now it seems that the stakes are so high that if you disagree with me, you are against me and everything I stand for; you are my close-minded enemy whom I hate. So, I've got a bad feeling about what our country is going to look like after whoever wins on November 3. How sad it is that a political season does not leave us with much hope for a better tomorrow as to how we could work together as a nation that rallies around our leaders?

I guess that you could say this all centers around our personal preferences as to the party you want to submit your individual authority to. If your party loses, you do not have a choice; they are your new leader whom you are to live under and obey. Yet how can you obey if that party goes against everything you believe?

To declare yourself a "Christian," you confess that there is one God who is above all. It is He who commands that we have no other gods, let alone any who are above Him. Therefore, this also means that we are <u>under</u> His authority of what is right and what is wrong; we are to <u>submit</u> to His way for our life. It is something we struggle with greatly. Our rebellion is our sin which earns our damnation from His presence. But out of His immense love, He punished His only begotten Son in our place in order that we could be forgiven and live under Him in His kingdom forever and ever. In response to such an amazing love, we do our best to set aside our own wants and desires to live <u>under</u> God's care.

This is something we pray about each time we pray, "Thy kingdom come," in The Lord's Prayer. When we pray this, we are ultimately asking our Father in heaven three things. The <u>first</u> is that the Triune God would rule over my life. It is a prayer that He would change *my* will to *His* will that I may see His love for all people and the dangers of sin. <u>Second</u>, we pray that God's reign would come to the lives of others... especially to those who do not want His rule in their lives. We know where a life apart from Christ Jesus will lead and we do not want that for ANYBODY! And <u>third</u>, we pray for the coming of the Last Day, when Jesus will come to give eternal life to all believers who will live with Him forever.

Yet it is those three little words that do not give me a bad feeling about our future, but a sure and great hope for what is to come under Christ's reign. In these days of political and social unrest, may we in the amazing faith that has been given us pray all the more, "Thy kingdom come..." that more may come to see and embrace the <u>only</u> true ruler there is.

Humble Stewards

As stewards, we are the recipients and caretakers of God's goodness, love, mercy, and grace. Stewards are managers of God's creation. We acknowledge God as the owner; therefore, we are to act not as owners but as managers because our lives and resources are simply on loan from Him.

The book of Daniel gives an account of a man who failed to recognize God as Creator and provider and exalted himself. King Nebuchadnezzar, walking on the roof of "his" royal palace, surveying "his" kingdom, was overcome by pride as he announced, "Is not this the great Babylon I have built as the royal residence, by my mighty power and for the glory of my majesty" (Daniel 4:30)? He thought he was asking a rhetorical question, but God condemned him to live like an animal as a consequence of his pride.

Pride is destructive. It destroys gratitude to God for all His kindness to us. It destroys our desire and ability to serve others. It destroys contentment for it feeds our competitive nature so that we are not satisfied with just being wealthy or intelligent, but we want to be wealthier and more intelligent than anyone else.

Pride has no place in the life of a servant. First Peter 5:6 reads, "Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand that He may lift you up in due time." It is God alone Who can exalt us (Psalm 75:7). If Christ Himself, God's only begotten Son, humbled Himself, should we not follow His example and humble ourselves? Because Christ humbled Himself, God exalted Him (Philippians 2:9)

David, the shepherd-king, put our situation in proper perspective: "When I consider Your heavens, the work of Your fingers, the moon and the stars, which You have set in place, what is man that You are mindful of him, the son of man that You care for him" (Psalm 8:3-4)? The inference is that we are insignificant, yet David goes on to remind us of what we can be proud: "You made [us] ruler over the works of Your hands; You put everything under [our] feet."

Humility allows us to accept our smallness and God's goodness. In the words of Martin Luther, humility is the decision to "let God be God". We are stewards through humility. We are to honor Him with what we have, what we are, and what He will make of us.
