November 2020 Newsletter

This weekend, I learned that a friend that I had worked with years ago had tested positive for COVID. He was doing well in his home quarantine as his wife and family were taking good care of him. His days were fairly normal as all he felt was a little tired with a fever here and there. The weirdest thing for him was having to let the folks and places he had been in contact with, know he tested positive for COVID and that they need to be cautious. Although he was feeling okay... soon many of the people he was in contact with also begam to test positive. This was the beginning of a wave of guilt that was setting in. He was the reason others contracted the COVID virus. Then, those folks began to have more serious symptoms than he was having. Some went to the ER. One was hospitalized. And the guilt kept growing.

How would you feel if you were in my friend's shoes? So many of us have said, "If I get it, I'll deal with it." but what if someone you know contracts COVID from you? What if they need to be hospitalized or worse, die from the complications COVID brings? The guilt of knowing these infections stemmed from you can be overpowering. How would you deal with it?

It can be easy for us to boldly declare we can handle anything that comes our way and be just fine. Yet when something we have done impacts and hurts another person, what are we to do? Brush it off? Apologize? Cover their medical expenses? Will that make everything better?

One of the hardest things for us to come to terms with is that we are not perfect. When we unintentionally fail, others will get hurt in one way or another. When we intentionally fail, others will get hurt. But worst of all, in any of our failings, we could cause others to sin. How serious is this? In Mark chapter 9, Jesus declares that, "Whoever causes on of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were hung around his neck and he were thrown into the sea." (9:42). Jesus then continues with a reminder that if a part of your body causes you to sin, cut it off (9:43, 45, 47).

According to Jesus, our lake and river bottoms around here should be filled with bodies of sinners, and anyone left would be immensely crippled. Does this mean that Jesus was not serious, and that we were not taking Him at His Word? No. Jesus knew that the true root of the problem lies deep within each one of our hearts. When our eyes are opened to what it is we have done against one another and against God Himself, the guilt is more than enough to pull us down to the depths of the sea. Utterly helpless, the guilt will drown us.

Jesus closes off chapter 9 with a seemingly out of place statement that, "Salt is good, but if the salt has lost its saltiness, how will you make it salty again? Have salt in yourselves, and be at peace with one another." (9:50). Just as you can not make salt salty again, we cannot make ourselves sinless. We need something amazing to create within us clean hearts and lives to save us (and keep others from sinning).

We recall Peter denied Jesus three times the night Jesus was arrested. People missed out on a opportunity to hear about Jesus that night because of Peter's sinful denial. Jesus knew Peter would betray Him earlier that night. Jesus knew that betrayal would come the night Peter asked to walk out to Jesus on the water. When Peter's eyes were off of Jesus, he began to sink, crying out, "Lord, save me!" (Matthew 14:30). Jesus could have thrown a millstone around Peter's neck and let him drown right then and there. But He did not. Instead, Jesus reached out to Peter and brought him to safety in the boat.

When we are drowning in guilt, Jesus is there with His nail-pierced hand, extended to you and me, with the promise that He has us. In our sins we lose Him and His holiness in our lives. But He comes to you, always there with His loving hand extended, declaring "I have you. You are Mine." It is a promise that we can depend upon for it is sealed by His blood. His forgiveness is real and it is freeing. The sting of guilt may remain, yet by the forgiveness He has won for us on the cross, we can acknowledge where we have erred, and strive towards the goal of walking in the light of Christ each day as we forgive as we have been forgiven.

Pastor Jonathan Cluppert from Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Arbor Vitae has accepted a call to be the pastor at First Lutheran Church in Rice Lake, WI. As the movement of pastors within the church may affect one or two congregations at a time, some calls can leave a bigger impact. Since Pastor Cluppert also served as our circuit visitor/counselor, he will be stepping away from a role that assisted other congregations in our area with various needs. Our district president, Rev. Part of God's Plan

"In those days . . ." So begins a well-known passage of Scripture. Do you know what comes next? "In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree . . ." (Luke 2:1). Some of us can quote the whole story by heart. Even though we've heard it year after year, some of us for many years, the story is still precious to hear, still warms our souls, still excites our minds, still calms our fears.

Two seemingly inconsequential people of little means obeyed that decree and traveled to the town of Bethlehem to register for the census. The woman, Mary, was about to have a child. She knew that her child was the Son of God, a child to be named Jesus. Joseph, her husband, knew he was not the father of the child, although that was how the world saw him. These were two of God's faithful. They knew the prophecies regarding the Messiah. They had been visited by the angel and learned that they were to be part of the fulfillment of those prophecies. They didn't know how things would turn out. They didn't know all that God had in store for them. They just "obey[ed their] rulers and submitted to their authority" (Hebrews 13:17) as they trusted God to guide and protect them and His Son each step they took on His path.

Of course, God did just that. He provided a place for the Child to be born (Luke 2:7). He sent angels to announce the birth of the King and moved the shepherds to respond to the joyful news and go to worship the new Baby (Luke 2:8-20). He sent "Magi from the East" who brought "gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh" and then believed the warning God gave them in a dream and avoided the evil King Herod on their return trip (Matthew 2:1-12).

How many of these people involved in this most wondrous story realized the important and memorable parts they played? We cannot say for sure but surmise none could really comprehend the eternal significance of the events as they unfolded.

We, too, are involved in God's plans. Certainly none can equal in importance the birth of Christ, but nothing God does is without purpose. Are we listening for the voice of the Spirit as He speaks to us through God's Word? Are we, as we go about our daily routines, obeying our rulers, cognizant of being God's feet and hands and voice to carry out His plan? Do we bring our gifts, aware that God may use them according to a purpose we can't even imagine? How exciting it is to think and know that we are God's instruments! What a loss of blessing to us if we refuse to let God use us and another gets the opportunity instead (Esther 4:14)!

As we live out our daily lives as stewards, "let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith . . . so that we will not grow weary and lose heart" (Hebrews 12:2-3), but instead look forward with eagerness and anticipation toward the unfolding of God's plan in our lives.
