2 Corinthians 5:20b—6:10

# **CONFESSIONAL ADDRESS**

Joel 2:12

We join in King David's prayer of confession in Psalm 51.

- P Against You, You only, have I sinned and done what is evil in Your sight,
- so that You may be justified in Your words and blameless in Your judgment.

- Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean;

Genesis 3:19

Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. <sup>17</sup>But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, <sup>18</sup>that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. <sup>19</sup>"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where

thieves break in and steal, <sup>20</sup>but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. <sup>21</sup>For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."
