






Backpack Blessing



OFFERING DONATION THE CONCORDIA BIBLE INSTITUTE SALESKA SCHOLARSHIP ENDOWMENT

The Rev. Dr. John Saleska founded the Concordia Bible Institute (CBI) back in 2000 after retiring from his 23-year faculty position at Concordia Theological Seminary in Fort Wayne, Indiana. In the summer of 2014 he retired a second time, as it were, by becoming the Director Emeritus of CBI, even as he maintained an office on campus and still came to work early every morning with briefcase in hand. Dr. Saleska then received his heavenly inheritance on September 12, 2017.

In honor of his legacy of teaching "Christ in Every Word" among us, CBI has established "The Concordia Bible Institute Saleska Scholarship Endowment," whose purpose is to provide financial assistance to pre-seminary students at Concordia University Wisconsin. In an age of biblical illiteracy, it is hoped that this endowment will help future pastors carry forward Dr. Saleska's lifelong conviction of teaching "Christ in Every Word" as they read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest the Scriptures.

KEYNOTE: Rev. Dr. Robert Weise

Professor Emeritus, The Lutheran Foundation of St. Louis Chair of Pastoral Ministry and Life Sciences, Department of Practical Theology, Concordía Seminary, St. Louis, MO.



Dr. Weise retired in 2014 after 22 years of distinguished service as Professor of Practical Theology and the Lutheran Foundation of St. Louis Chair in Pastoral Ministry and Life Sciences (1992-2014).

He received his Master of Divinity from Concordia Seminary (1982), a master's degree and a Ph.D. from the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign (1970, 1973); and a bachelor's degree from Eastern Illinois Uni-

versity in Charleston, III. (1967): zoology/cell biology/ bioethics.

Before joining the Seminary, he served as instructor at Kansas State University in Manhattan, Kan. (1972-73); research associate and assistant professor at Wayne State University School of Medicine, Detroit, Mich. (1973-78); pastor at Zion Lutheran Church in Bunker Hill, Ill. (1982-85); and senior pastor at Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Springfield, Ill. (1985-92).

He wrote the Bible study series Playing God: Redesigning Life (Concordia Publishing House) and Changing Currents: Embryonic Stem Cell Research with Robert Baker (Concordia Publishing House) and "Transgender Identity in Light of Biblical Identity" in Ethics of Sex: From Taboo to Delight (Concordia Publishing House).

He testified before the National Human Embryo Research Board as well as the National Bioethics Advisory Commission regarding human embryo research and cloning. He is a frequent speaker on those and other life topics. His research interests include creation as related to human sexuality (especially Transgenderism), end-of-life, Aging (Ageism), Assisted Reproductive Technologies, and current trends in genetics and artificial intelligence as these topics relate to what we believe, teach and confess according to the Scriptures and Confessions.

He and his wife, Janice, have five daughters and 10 grandchildren.

Rev. Lueck was born in Shelbyville, Illinois and grew up in Reedsburg, Wisconsin. He graduated from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis in 1979. He has served congregations in Nebraska and Oklahoma.

In 1987 he received a call from the LCMS North Wisconsin District to serve in the position of Mission, Evangelism, and Stewardship Executive. In June 2012 he was elected President of the LCMS North Wisconsin District and was re-elected in 2015 & 2018.

Dwayne is married to Cheryl. They have three children, Alison (married to David), Ben (married to Michelle), and Kim, and three grandchildren, Mila, Riley and Drake.
