

Colossians 2:6-7 Therefore, as you received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in him, ⁷ rooted and built up in him and established in the faith, just as you were taught, abounding in thanksgiving.

The sight of cargo ships off of the western coast of these United States has been quite unbelievable lately. Hundreds of vessels filled with consumer stuff, just floating there, waiting for the opportunity to bring their wares to be unloaded onto trucks and carried to various distribution facilities in order that you and I can continue to live a "normal" life. The frustration is growing on so many fronts! The captains of these ships want to unload and return to get more stuff. The stores are desperate to get the stuff. The president is even worried that the holiday spending numbers will be down because of the lack of stuff. All this stuff is out there, with the desire to get it into your hands... but something is keeping it from coming to you. This is a lot of fuss over stuff.

As consumers, we do not like the idea of having to wait to get our "stuff." Think of how frustrated you may get when you have to wait. Maybe it is for service at a restaurant. Maybe it is for something you ordered that is taking extra long to get to you. Maybe it is the time spent waiting in the waiting room in the doctor's office or a red light. We know what is coming, but when something is hindering its arrival how frustrating it all is!

I suppose that we have every right to be frustrated with God then as well. After all, He declares that He is coming back to put an end to sin, death, and the power of the devil. The promise is there that when He returns, our loved ones who have died in the faith will be risen to live again. The promise is there that heaven will be amazing! There are all these amazing things just waiting to come to us! But something is holding them back.

Maybe it is that we are not being good enough at keeping God's Word. Maybe we are not working hard enough to give everybody the opportunity to hear God's Good News of Jesus. Maybe our world and the people here are too far beyond saving.

When we think of God's relationship with us like that of a financial market, it is all the more easy for us to be upset with Him for what He is NOT giving us. Because our focus is on what we DON'T have... we forget to see what we do have.

What are the blessings God gives you each day? Blessings that you do not have to wait for? Each day, God blesses us with the opportunity to hear His Word and by faith, believe in His promises. Each day, God provides us with our "daily bread" that we can not only receive with thanksgiving, but share it with people around us. Each day God reminds us that He sent His only begotten Son to die in order that we could be forgiven of our sins and have a right relationship with Him. Each day, God surrounds us with blessings of people, food, clothing, shelter, and so much more; He even opens our eyes to see that they come from Him!

Yes, when Jesus returns, many great things will be ours. But may we never forget or fail to see what great things God has given us yesterday and today, and how He promises to take care of us tomorrow. Thanks be to God! Amen.

Part of God's Plan

"In those days . . ." So begins a well-known passage of Scripture. Do you know what comes next? "In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree . . ." (Luke 2:1). Some of us can quote the whole story by heart. Even though we've heard it year after year, some of us for many years, the story is still precious to hear, still warms our souls, still excites our minds, still calms our fears.

Two seemingly inconsequential people of little means obeyed that decree and traveled to the town of Bethlehem to register for the census. The woman, Mary, was about to have a child. She knew that her child was the Son of God, a child to be named Jesus. Joseph, her husband, knew he was not the father of the child, although that was how the world saw him. These were two of God's faithful. They knew the prophecies regarding the Messiah. They had been visited by the angel and learned that they were to be part of the fulfillment of those prophecies. They didn't know how things would turn out. They didn't know all that God had in store for them. They just "obey[ed their] rulers and submitted to their authority" (Hebrews 13:17) as they trusted God to guide and protect them and His Son each step they took on His path.

Of course, God did just that. He provided a place for the Child to be born (Luke 2:7). He sent angels to announce the birth of the King and moved the shepherds to respond to the joyful news and go to worship the new Baby (Luke 2:8-20). He sent "Magi from the East" who brought "gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh" and then believed the warning God gave them in a dream and avoided the evil King Herod on their return trip (Matthew 2:1-12).

How many of these people involved in this most wondrous story realized the important and memorable parts they played? We cannot say for sure but surmise none could really comprehend the eternal significance of the events as they unfolded.

We, too, are involved in God's plans. Certainly none can equal in importance the birth of Christ, but nothing God does is without purpose. Are we listening for the voice of the Spirit as He speaks to us through God's Word? Are we, as we go about our daily routines, obeying our rulers, cognizant of being God's feet and hands and voice to carry out His plan? Do we bring our gifts, aware that God may use them according to a purpose we can't even imagine? How exciting it is to think and know that we are God's instruments! What a loss of blessing to us if we refuse to let God use us and another gets the opportunity instead (Esther 4:14)!

As we live out our daily lives as stewards, "let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith . . . so that we will not grow weary and lose heart" (Hebrews 12:2-3), but instead look forward with eagerness and anticipation toward the unfolding of God's plan in our lives.
