## HYMN OF THE MONTH - 762 THERE IS A TIME FOR EVERYTHING

*This hymn, based on Ecclesiastes 3, was written by Stephen Starke in remembrance of the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001. Stanza 2 recalls the hours and days after the attack, as people searched, hoped, and prayed for all those who were in the destroyed World Trade Center, the Pentagon, and the field in Pennsylvania, paraphrasing Ecclesiastes 3:6 as “a time to search and then to end.”*

A time to plant, a time to reap, A time to laugh, a time to weep,  
A time to heal, a time to slay, A time to build where rubble lay,  
A time to die, a time to mourn, A time for joy and to be born,

For they will deliver you over to councils, and you will be beaten in synagogues, and you will stand before governors and kings for my sake, to bear witness before them. <sup>10</sup>And the gospel must first be proclaimed to all nations. <sup>11</sup>And when they bring you to trial and deliver you over, do not be anxious beforehand what you are to say, but say whatever is given you in that hour, for it is not you who speak, but the Holy Spirit. <sup>12</sup>And brother will deliver brother over to death, and the father his child, and children will rise against parents and have them put to death. <sup>13</sup>And you will be hated by all for my name’s sake. But the one who endures to the end will be saved.”
