## HYMN OF THE MONTH – 411 I WANT TO WALK AS A CHILD OF THE LIGHT

This hymn written by Kathleen Thomerson in the summer of 1966 was originally intended as a choral anthem but soon was used as a hymn in various denominations. Thomerson created this hymn somewhat unexpectantly after studying Scripture passages that dealt with nurturing a childlike faith.
