HYMN OF THE MONTH - 825 RISE, SHINE, YOU PEOPLE

Stanza 3 reflects a joy that cannot help but scoff at Satan, the joy-robber, and speak about Christ, the joy-giver. The image of unfurled banners recalls the prophecy in which Isaiah calls the Messiah a banner to whom all people can rally (Isaiah 11:10-12). In stanza 4, the story of Jesus is a Trinity-created story of salvation, life, and freedom by which the Holy Spirit draws humans to faith. Believers are made new (2 Corinthians 5:17) as we are united through Baptism with the crucified and risen Christ.

Deuteronomy 34:1–12

¹Then Moses went up from the plains of Moab to Mount Nebo, to the top of Pisgah, which is opposite Jericho. And the LORD showed him all the land, Gilead as far as Dan, ²all Naphtali, the land of Ephraim and Manasseh, all the land of Judah as far as the western sea, ³the Negeb, and the Plain, that is, the Valley of Jericho the city of palm trees, as far as Zoar. ⁴And the LORD said to him, "This is the land of which I swore to Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, 'I will give it to your offspring.' I have let you see it with your eyes, but you shall not go over there." ⁵So Moses the servant of the LORD died there in the land of Moab, according to the word of the LORD, ⁶and he buried him in the valley in the land of Moab opposite Beth-peor; but no one knows the place of his burial to this day. ⁵Moses was 120 years old when he died. So the people of Israel obeyed him and did as the LORD had commanded Moses. ¹0And there has not arisen a prophet since in Israel like Moses, whom the LORD knew face to face, ¹¹none like him for all the signs and the wonders that the LORD sent him to do in the land of Egypt, to Pharaoh and to all his servants and to all his land, ¹²and for all the mighty power and all the great deeds of terror that Moses did in the sight of all Israel.
