HYMN OF THE MONTH - 432 IN SILENT PAIN THE ETERNAL SON

Hymn writer Christopher Idle noted that hymn writers often produce hymns that display Christ's majesty and power, but rarely his cross. Idle responded in 1989 with this hymn that was first titled "Strangest Victory". The text is based on 1 Peter 2:21-25, which is woven into verse two where we see that Christ died "that we might die to sin and live to righteousness".
