EASTER HYMN - 466 CHRIST HAS ARISEN, ALLELUIA

This popular Easter hymn text was written by a young theologian named Bernard Kyamanywa in 1966 while as a student at the seminary in Tanzania. The hymn tune is from the Haya people of western Tanzania. Throughout the hymn we have the story of Jesus' resurrection told in a straightforward manner.
