¹Now the apostles and the brothers who were throughout Judea heard that the Gentiles also had received the word of God. ²So when Peter went up to Jerusalem, the circumcision party criticized him, saying, ³"You went to uncircumcised men and ate with them." ⁴But Peter began and explained it to them in order: ⁵"I was in the city of Joppa praying, and in a trance I saw a vision, something like a great sheet descending, being let down from heaven by its four corners, and it came down to me. ⁶Looking at it closely, I observed animals and beasts of prey and reptiles and birds of the air. ⁷And I heard a voice saying to me, 'Rise, Peter; kill and eat.' ⁸But I said, 'By no means, Lord; for nothing common or unclean has ever entered my mouth.' ⁹But the voice answered a second time from heaven, 'What God has made clean, do not call common.' 10This happened three times, and all was drawn up again into heaven. 11 And behold, at that very moment three men arrived at the house in which we were, sent to me from Caesarea. ¹²And the Spirit told me to go with them, making no distinction. Pastor: What is Baptism?

Pastor:

Confirmands: Baptism is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God's command and combined

with God's Word.

People: Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the

Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Matthew 28:19

What benefits does Baptism give? Pastor:

Confirmands: It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to

all who believe this.

Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be People:

condemned. Mark 16:16

Pastor: How can water do such great things?

Confirmands:

Baptism is a life-giving water, rich in grace, and a washing of the new birth in the Holy Spirit.

He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He People: poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by His grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life. Titus 3:5-8

What does such baptizing with water indicate?

Confirmands: The Old Adam in us should by daily contrition and repentance be drowned and die with all sins and evil desires, and that a new man should daily emerge and arise to live before God

in righteousness and purity forever.

People: We were therefore buried with Him through Baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a

new life. Romans 6:4

Pastor: In Holy Baptism we are forgiven our sins and granted a new life in Christ, our Lord. We solemnly renounce the devil and all his works and all his ways; we confess the gift of faith in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. I ask you anew: Do you renounce the devil
