

#### June '22 Newsletter

Over the past month farmers throughout the states have been working extremely hard, long hours to get their seeds planted in preparation and anticipation of a future crop and harvest. Rightfully so as this is security for their livelihood and future. That crop will not only provide financial resources for their family, but offer food and resources for people throughout the world. This is an exciting and important time, as we await to see what will become of that little seed.

There are so many variables at stake for that seed's future. While some such as a brutal cold snap or too much/too little rain are far out of the farmer's control, there are a few things that a good farmer can assist with to ensure that seed has the best shot at a successful future. And it all begins with taking care of that soil.

In Matthew 13, Jesus tells the parable of the sower sowing his seed. Some of the seeds do not have much of a chance as they land on ground that will not be beneficial for their future. Yet the seed that hits that proper soil, wow does it produce! And this makes sense as farmers take care to see that the soil is tilled, proper nutrients are applied, weeds are taken, and of course the rocks are picked. The cares of the world, trouble and hardships, and laziness to take care of that seed, all set the Word of God up for failure.

This is never a comfortable question for us to reflect on. But it is an important one to acknowledge if we truly want God's blessings and future in our life and the lives of our children.

As we work hard while the weather is warm to take care of things and to rightfully relax and enjoy, may we never forget that we need to tend to the spiritual soil that is in our care. May we continue to seek our heavenly Father, that He would continue to prepare us to properly receive His Word in order that it would grow healthy and strong in our lives and the lives of our children.

Summer is busy. My prayer for you and your family is that there will always be time made for God's Word to be sown in your busy schedules. Yes that does mean that when you are out on vacation, it is good for you to find a church (preferably LCMS ③) to let your soil be sown. Take time with your family around the fire to share in a devotion. Take time in the car to listen to the Lutheran Hour as a family (and even talk about what you learned after it was over).



#### Money and the Great Commission

Jesus' parting command was: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:19-20). Jesus was very direct and explicit with His mandate. There is no question as to where or with whom we are to share the Gospel. The love that God gives to us is to be shared by us with all people everywhere. He has given us our marching orders, and, in His strength, we can give ourselves fully to His work.

Because God has chosen to use us as His tools to bring salvation to all people, we must use our lives and gifts to spread the Good News. Paul wrote, "We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making His appeal through us" (2 Corinthians 5:20). One of the tools that God gives us to use in our mission of reaching out to others with the Gospel is our money. According to an old stewardship phrase, "Stewardship without mission is unnecessary and mission without stewardship is impossible." Stewardship and mission are inseparable. The funding of the Great Commission needs to come from believers. The money which God entrusts to us has many purposes, and the funding of mission work is of first importance. Through the giving of our money, we demonstrate our obedience to Jesus' command to reach out to all people. Paul wrote that, through our giving, we "test the sincerity of [our] love by comparing it with the earnestness of others" (2 Corinthians 8:8).

For nonbelievers and those who lack spiritual maturity, the giving of money is done begrudgingly out of a sense of obligation. By the grace of God, our attitude toward giving is a "want to" rather than a "got to" give. We view giving as a privilege and an opportunity to spread the Gospel through our money. Our giving expresses our gratitude for who God is and all that He has done for through His Son. Through faith, we hold onto our money loosely and then are privileged to experience the joy of giving as we give God our first and best. As Christians we understand that God has a claim on all that we have, so we willingly and cheerfully give our money to help all people hear of God's love. Money is an important tool for God's mission. Through our faithful giving, we are able to leverage our witnessing to all people.

#### **Our Savior Lutheran Church Endowment Committee**

#### May 4, 2022 Meeting Minutes submitted by Chairperson Becky Pokrandt

The Endowment Committee was called to order at 10:10 AM on May 4, 2022. All members were in attendance: Pastor Kufahl, Alvin Barden, Rick Steinke, Barb Patterson, Pat Grosse, and Becky Pokrandt.

Pat Grosse opened with prayer followed with the treasurer's report and the Lutheran Legacy Endowment Fund balance as of 3-31-22. A check was recently received by Lutheran Legacy for \$5017.00 which will be applied to the grant application process for 2023.

Under new business, the committee reviewed the grant applications from 2022 with discussion and thoughts going forward. There were two separate applications this year, as follows:

The Our Savior Evangelism Committee applied for \$300.00 to put toward children's games/bounce house for the June 19th outdoor worship service in the church parking lot. A motion was made by Rick Steinke to accept this request and a 2<sup>nd</sup> was made by Barb Patterson. Motion carried.

DCE Intern Andrew Kaufmann applied for a grant of \$2000.00 to apply toward the National Youth Gathering Trip to Houston, Texas in July. This would help offset the expenses of the trip. With discussion of their current budget and funds already raised, it was suggested that an additional amount could be afforded to them. A motion was made by Al Barden to offer \$2500.00 to the Our Savior Lutheran Youth who will be traveling to the LCMS National Youth Gathering in Houston this summer. A 2<sup>nd</sup> was given by Barb Patterson and motion was carried.

These recommendations for the grant applicants will be put forth to the Church Council at the next Council meeting for approval. If approved, each applicant will receive the recommended and approved grant amounts.

Further discussion was had among the committee to carry over the remaining \$3300.00 and include it with the recently received \$5017.00, thus making the 2023 Endowment Grant opportunity an amount not to exceed \$8,317.00.

Pastor Kufahl discussed an upcoming idea for commissioned art renditions to be painted of the various events in the Life of Christ. More information will be forthcoming at a later date.

Rick Steinke and Pat Grosse brought up for discussion thoughts of the carport topic that is being studied by the Trustees. It was discussed that this project could possibly qualify as a grant application by someone, in the next window of grant applications. The committee was also urged to serve as ambassadors to the congregation in the upcoming months and make congregational members aware of the grant dollar amount available in 2023 and urge members to think of creative projects they'd like to see come to fruition within the church, and apply for a grant.

Becky Pokrandt – chairperson announced that at the end of December her term as chairperson will expire and that she has prayerfully considered not to renew her service to the committee. This allows the committee time to search for a new chairperson, which is a 3 year term.

The next meeting date has been scheduled for November 9, 2022 at 10:00 AM in the fellowship hall.

Pastor Kufahl closed with prayer and the meeting was adjourned at 11:00 AM.
