

Curriculum – We are in Year 2 of our Enduring Faith curriculum that focuses on the Old Testament. A weekly Sunday school email is sent to families each Monday which includes ideas for reviewing and reinforcing the lesson throughout the week.

Birthday Celebrations – Children receive a card, memory verse card, and small gift on their birthdays. Thank you to Holly Nier who prepares the cards & gifts for the children!

Singing for Worship – Students, grades 1-8, are invited to sing for worship with the adult choir on Sunday, October 29th, at 7:30 and 10 am. We will have a special rehearsal with the adult choir on Saturday, October 28th, 9-9:45 am. Our junior choir and chime choir will sing/ring on Sunday, October 15th, at the 10 am service.

Memory Treasures – Bible verses from our curriculum were chosen for our memory verse for each month. Students in grades 1-8 receive Bible pins for memorizing each verse and parts of the Catechism.

Mission Project – Operation Christmas Child sends shoe box gifts to children in need around the world. Please consider shopping for new toys, including "Wow" gifts (soccer balls, stuffed animals, dolls, etc.), for our packing party on Sunday, October 29th, at 8:45 am. Just a reminder that we cannot send candy, food, or toothpaste. Families and individuals are welcome to fill boxes at home or online. Shipping costs are \$10 per box. The \$10 includes the cost of a Bible book that is packed in each box. Many of the children who receive a box will have the opportunity to attend a Bible class. Children's Christmas Service – Our children's Christmas service will be Sunday, December 17th, at the 10 am service. Through drama, Scripture, and special music we will celebrate how Jesus, the King of kings, came in humble ways to be our Savior through His death and resurrection. Part of God's Plan

"In those days . . ." So begins a well-known passage of Scripture. Do you know what comes next? "In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree . . ." (Luke 2:1). Some of us can quote the whole story by heart. Even though we've heard it year after year, some of us for many years, the story is still precious to hear, still warms our souls, still excites our minds, still calms our fears.

Two seemingly inconsequential people of little means obeyed that decree and traveled to the town of Bethlehem to register for the census. The woman, Mary, was about to have a child. She knew that her child was the Son of God, a child to be named Jesus. Joseph, her husband, knew he was not the father of the child, although that was how the world saw him. These were two of God's faithful. They knew the prophecies regarding the Messiah. They had been visited by the angel and learned that they were to be part of the fulfillment of those prophecies. They didn't know how things would turn out. They didn't know all that God had in store for them. They just "obey[ed their] rulers and submitted to their authority" (Hebrews 13:17) as they trusted God to guide and protect them and His Son each step they took on His path.

Of course, God did just that. He provided a place for the Child to be born (Luke 2:7). He sent angels to announce the birth of the King and moved the shepherds to respond to the joyful news and go to worship the new Baby (Luke 2:8-20). He sent "Magi from the East" who brought "gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh" and then believed the warning God gave them in a dream and avoided the evil King Herod on their return trip (Matthew 2:1-12).

How many of these people involved in this most wondrous story realized the important and memorable parts they played? We cannot say for sure but surmise none could really comprehend the eternal significance of the events as they unfolded.

We, too, are involved in God's plans. Certainly none can equal in importance the birth of Christ, but nothing God does is without purpose. Are we listening for the voice of the Spirit as He speaks to us through God's Word? Are we, as we go about our daily routines, obeying our rulers, cognizant of being God's feet and hands and voice to carry out His plan? Do we bring our gifts, aware that God may use them according to a purpose we can't even imagine? How exciting it is to think and know that we are God's instruments! What a loss of blessing to us if we refuse to let God use us and another gets the opportunity instead (Esther 4:14)!

As we live out our daily lives as stewards, "let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith . . . so that we will not grow weary and lose heart" (Hebrews 12:2-3), but instead look forward with eagerness and anticipation toward the unfolding of God's plan in our lives.
