#### Children's Ministry Report (Birth-Grade 6) February 2024

#### Sunday School -

Mission Projects - During February we continue to support Phil's Friends, a non-profit whose mission is to provide Christ-centered support and hope to those affected by cancer. For a \$100 donation, Phil's Friends will send a care package and 12 months of Cards of Hope to a cancer patient. Our goal is \$300 to provide hope in Jesus for three cancer patients. We will also color Cards of Hope on our Mission Sunday, February 25th. Thank you for sharing God's love through your offerings!

Bible Reading Challenge – Our Sunday school students can take part in a Bible reading challenge until February 25<sup>th</sup>. To take part in the challenge, students fill out a chart for every 5 minutes of Bible reading. A Bible buck is given after every 20 minutes of reading. Parents/guardians need to sign the chart prior to turning it into teachers. \$1 will be given to our current mission project for every 5 minutes of reading. The classroom that reads the most minutes will receive prizes!

Bible GameDay/Mission Sunday – On Sunday, February 25<sup>th</sup>, we are having a Bible game day and mission project focus during the education hour. Students will color Cards of Hope for cancer patients that will be distributed through Phil's Friends (See information above). They will enjoy Bible games with their class and the Bible buck store will be open. Anyone interested in helping to make the Bible games, please let me know!

Music Opportunities – Our chime choir is preparing to play for worship on Sunday, February 18<sup>th</sup>, and for the midweek Lent service on March 13<sup>th</sup>. The junior choir is preparing to sing for worship on Wednesday, February 21<sup>st</sup>, and Sunday, March 10<sup>th</sup>. Our Sunday school students will sing with the adult choir on Palm Sunday, March 24<sup>th</sup>, at both services. A special rehearsal is planned Saturday, March 23<sup>rd</sup>, at 9 am.

#### Family Ministry / Cradle Roll -

Lent Begins – Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14<sup>th</sup>. Our midweek Lenten services will be held at 4:30 pm and online. On Ash Wednesday two services will be offered at 4:30 & 7 pm.

Chapel for Home School Families – Pastor and I continue to offer chapel for home school families on the last Wednesday of the month at 11 am. Our February chapel will be February 28th.

Family Resources – Each Monday I send an email to families to review our Sunday school lesson and to share the Family Activity Page (families with 5K-8<sup>th</sup> grade) and the God Talk sheet (families with 2-3 year olds). I also share reminders and upcoming events.

Staffed Nursery – We have approximately \$250 left in a grant that helped us support and pay a nursery director. I'd like to use some of those funds to update our worship bags for children. I'd like to purchase new Bible related books and activities that could engage children during worship. They continue to listen and learn while they stay busy during worship!

College Students – We have an additional \$100 for college ministry from the Martha Society. Should care packages be sent again this semester? Any other ideas to encourage them in their faith?

Faith Legacy Retreat for 5th/6th/7th grade Girls and Moms – We have four families committed to our mother/daughter retreat for preteen girls and their moms on March 15th/16th at Camp Luther. Laura Campbell will be our speaker and a group of women are helping to make the weekend a memorable one for the girls and their moms. The purpose of the weekend is to strengthen the mother/daughter bond, encourage communication, and discuss upcoming changes and relationships in the teen years.

#### Vacation Bible School -

Registration has begun for the "The Great Jungle Journey" Vacation Bible School which will be held August 5<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> from 9noon each day for children ages 3-12. Children will take an epic cruise from Genesis to Revelation to discover that history is centered on His Story, the story of Jesus and God's plan of salvation for us. A closing program and lunch are tentatively scheduled for Thursday, August 8<sup>th</sup>, at 11:30 am.

Volunteers - I've started checking in with former volunteers to see if they are able to help this year. New volunteers are welcome!

VBS Conference - Carol Litchfield, Mike Rieck, and I enjoyed the VBS training and showcase we attended at the Ark Encounter on January 26th & 27th. On Friday we listened to various speakers who gave us Biblical, apologetic, and informative talks about the 7 Cs of history which will be covered during VBS this summer. On Saturday we learned and explored various aspects of VBS including the Bible teaching, crafts, snacks, drama overview, decorating ideas, software, and general tips about The Great Jungle Journey. After reading the Bible lessons and attending the Bible overview session I feel prepared to equip our Bible teachers. I also have new ideas for organization and kid appeal. Supplies - All supplies are purchased (including T-shirts) from Answers in Genesis with a discount and free shipping. Snack, craft, decoration, and game materials/supplies will still need to be purchased or collected.

# Evangelism meeting February 5, 2024

Old business: Northwoods Share Dinner; Preparations have been completed for the dinner. The dinner will be served on February 20th. The Incredible Bank staff have offered to supply servers to help with the meal, as well as helping with the finances. The dinner will be picked up at about 4:30 pm and delivered to the Rock for service at 5:00 pm. Pastor Kufahl will deliver the devotion and blessing. We will be serving approximately 110 people.

<u>New business:</u> The Easter Basket program is coming in March. The board decided to go with a breakfast theme this year. The monetary value for each bag/basket was set at \$35.00. Jim will coordinate with Mike at Trig's for the setup for each bag with the price limit in mind. If everything goes as planned, help will be needed to deliver the bags/basket to area schools of Eagle River Elementary, St. Germain Elementary, Land O Lakes Elementary, and Phelps School on Thursday, March 21, 2024.

#### Community Outreach Ideas and suggestions:

Pastor Kufahl reported that a couple of new families joining our congregation, stated that they received their information from our booth at the Farmer's Market. <u>God is</u>

<u>Amazing!!</u> We will continue to have a presence at the Farmer's Market as one Outreach to our community. Other ideas for Community Outreach were suggested and discussed. They are as follows;

Contact the local Chamber of Commerce for ideas for other needs in our community. Also contact city hall for other ideas. Greg will follow through with these ideas.

Joe suggested that we purchase gift cards from our local businesses and had them out to our congregation and others to be used in support of said businesses.

Another possible outreach suggested is contacting a local chapter/organization that is working to stop human trafficking in our community and surrounding areas. These are only a few suggestions and ideas to extend our evangelism outreach to our and other surrounding communities. Other ideas and suggestions are welcome and will be discussed by the Board.

#### Do Not Be Afraid!

"A young man dressed in a white robe . . . said, 'You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, Who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him. But go, tell His disciples and Peter . . . ' " (Mark 16:5-7).

"Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled from the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid" (Mark 16:8).

Who wouldn't tremble and be afraid! You go to anoint a body to prepare it for a proper burial, but the body is missing. Then some ethereal creature tells you the body isn't there because it is no longer dead but alive. Who could take it in? "Don't be alarmed" the man in white said. Yeah, right!

Yet, looking back, perhaps the women remembered the thousands He had fed with only two fish and five loaves of bread (Matthew 14:15-21). Maybe they thought again about the raising of Lazarus from the dead (John 11:38-44). After all, He was the one who had stilled the raging sea (Mark 4:35-41).

Somewhere, sometime, that trembling and bewilderment turned to joy and faith, for they did go tell His disciples and Peter (Matthew 28:8). And Jesus met them and greeted them, and they worshipped Him. "Then Jesus said to them, 'Do not be afraid. Go and tell My brothers . . . '" (Matthew 28:9-10).

Jesus' last command is the same as this one: Don't be afraid. Go and tell. We can understand the fear of the women at the empty tomb. What are we afraid of? Trouble? Or hardship? Persecution? Or famine? Nakedness? Or danger? Or sword? There is no fear in these things! "No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him Who loved us" (Romans 8:35, 37). We have the benefit of history. The women at the tomb couldn't fathom the outcome, but we have God's Word that assures us of our victory in Christ. We have His promise, "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). So don't be afraid! Go and tell!

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!
