## Canoeing the Mountains

*Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be frightened, and do not be dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go. Joshua 1:9*

For the last two years I have been a part of a learning community with PLI (Pastoral Leadership Institute). The program included reading several books on leadership. One book that I found particularly helpful is called *Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory* by Tod Bolsinger. The title caught my attention right away. First of all, I love canoeing. But canoeing is done on lakes and rivers. You don't canoe mountains. I was intrigued. What was this book about and what did it have to do with Christian leadership?

The driving illustration is derived from the expedition of Meriwether Lewis and William Clark from 1803 to 1806 known as the Corps of Discovery Expedition. They were sent by President Thomas Jefferson to explore and map the newly acquired territory of the Louisiana Purchase, and, if possible, to find a navigable waterway to the Pacific Ocean. They were the perfect duo for the expedition.


They made their way up the Missouri River in their canoes and made many discoveries along the way. Then they came to the point when they could canoe no more. The river came to an end. They were faced with the great Rocky Mountains. What were they to do? Canoes don't work well for crossing mountain ranges. They had three choices. They could turn around and go back because there were no more rivers to canoe. They could stay there. Or they could go on. Lewis and Clark kept their eyes on the real mission. They weren't on a mission to canoe. They were on a mission to get to the Pacific Ocean. So they left behind canoeing (for a while) and decided to keep going. They crossed the mountains and eventually got to the Pacific Ocean.

The key point that Bolsinger is making is that the Christian Church is finding itself in uncharted territory these days. (Actually, the book was written long before anyone had ever heard of COVID-19, but how appropriate it is for us today.) We have been doing church one way for a long time (canoeing), but now we find ourselves in a different world (mountains). What will we do as we face these new challenges? We could turn back by trying to remake things like they were in the good old days which will never happen. Or we could stay stuck where we are by doing the same things we have always been doing and hope for different results. Or we could remember that our mission is to make disciples and figure out how to do that in our current setting.

Dear fellow members of Hope,

We come into the world with nothing, and we leave with nothing; however, while we are here we are blessed with gifts that sustain our lives as well as with relationships with others. This letter focuses on the “things” that we have and the ninth commandment: “You shall not covet your neighbor’s house.” I teach the sixth graders that this commandment refers to inanimate (non-living) things and that the tenth concerns living beings.

I have always appreciated the expression, “You get what you get, and don’t throw a fit.” Our sinful nature is stifled when we learn to appreciate what we have and realize how much we are blessed. “We are blessed to be a blessing” is another favorite expression. This reminds us that what we have is not for our own success, power, fame, fortune, etc. but rather, it is for us to use to live to the glory of God and to let Him shine through all of our interactions.

I could add more examples, but I think that you understand the gist and have a sampling of how I teach our young disciples the meaning of this commandment. Question 90 in Luther’s Small Catechism (with Explanation) asks, “How are we tempted to be dissatisfied with what we have? Peer pressure and even advertising often encourage us to be dissatisfied with what we have. We crave other things in order to keep up appearances or to look for happiness and satisfaction in something new.”

I hope that you were able to view the video and that you enjoyed it. It reminded me of growing up and of one of the lessons that my father taught. If I were ever to feel sorry for myself for any reason, my father would always remind me that I was blessed more than I realized. If I didn’t have something, there was someone else who had less. If I were hurt or sick, there was someone who was more injured or someone who had greater illness.

This might tempt us to feel guilty for our blessings which brings us to the next question. Question 91 further asks, “Is all wanting, desiring, and ambition sinful? NO. God encourages us to seek His blessings of food, shelter, good jobs, health, success, and so on for ourselves and our family.”



# Postponed till June 7-16, 2022

An opportunity has come up for Pastor Ryden to participate in a 13-day trip to Israel and Jordan in April of 2021. He will get a chance to experience the Holy Land in an up-close-and-personal-way and to bring his experiences back to Hope in the form of bible studies, sermons, teachings and stories.

The trip will take place between April 28—May 11th, 2021. Areas that will be visited include Galilee, Bethlehem, Bethany, the Jordan River, the Dead Sea, Mt of Olives, the Garden of Gethsemane, the Upper Room, Mt Nebo and many other locations. The full cost of the trip, which includes air fare, hotel, most food, taxes, gratuity, visas and trip



insurance is \$6,000. That equates to approximately \$425 per day. Additional information is included in the brochure on the bulletin board in the Narthex.


