

Reminder from July 2018

Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light.

Matthew 11:28-30

Summer vacation. Those words ring in the ear of every child and fill their hearts with joy. No school for almost three months. No Math. No English. No Spelling. No History. Only the warm and free days of playing at the playground or swimming in the pool or riding the bicycle up and down the street. What can compare with the free and easy days of summer vacation? Then week two hits and it's "I'm bored. There's nothing to do."

We all, like children, long for those days of freedom from the daily burdens of life, but rarely find it. In summer, just as in other seasons, the burdens of life weigh us down. As adults, most of us don't have the pleasure of taking 3 months off of work. Even schoolteachers sometimes need to find summer jobs to supplement their regular income. We still have to work to pay the bills. There's still yard work to be done, laundry to be washed, meals to cook, and garbage to take out. Sometimes summer can be even more of a challenge because the kids don't have the regular routine of being in school and we constantly have to find constructive things for them to do. Perhaps we may find a week or two to get away for a family vacation. Those too can bring about their own kind of stress. In many ways summer vacation is not the idyllic time that we imagine it to be as children.

In our effort to find times of rest and relaxation, one "activity" that we are often tempted to omit is worship. When worship is seen as something we do, then the corollary is that if we don't do it then we will have more rest. We exchange the "obligation" to get up early on a Sunday morning for the "opportunity" to sleep in, thereby getting more rest. We exchange the "duty" of making sure that our Saturday schedule allows us to be in church for the "freedom" of being able to do what we want. Activity, obligation, duty. Are these words that you associate with worship? If so, then no wonder worship attendance goes down during the season that so many people associate with relaxation.

However, let me challenge you to think of worship differently. Is it possible to think of worship as rest? Jesus said, "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." When we come into the presence of Jesus, we find in him a God who takes the burden off of us to be our own god without the wisdom or power to deal with the challenges of life.

We are currently updating our Member database.

Dear fellow members of Hope,

The announcements before and after worship have included a slide regarding the Plastic Caps/Lids that we have collected for quite some time. This has been an ongoing endeavor that has helped numerous groups in a couple of ways. I am not necessarily looking to increase the volume of our collection; however, I could use some help with the caps/lids.

Why do we collect the caps/lids? These items are collected by various organizations so that they may be recycled into benches. Different organizations have different uses: sometimes they are used to commemorate something or to memorialize someone, and sometimes they are made into "Buddy Benches." We are NOT collecting for ourselves. Yet, we have been able to assist several organizations with our "stash" and have helped them to fulfill a need.

This past month, we passed along over 400 pounds of caps and lids. These were shared with Plainfield Central High School, Homer High School, and the American Legion in Lockport. Past stashes have been shared with the Ladies Auxiliary as well as the Girl Scouts.

How might you help? Once we receive the caps, they are sorted so that we are certain that we are passing along the right types of caps/lids. (The Coca-Cola caps are pulled—temporarily—until the cap codes can be entered to fulfill another ministry.) Then, places for drop-off are located or organizations in need are realized. Caps/lids are then disbursed!

In addition to help with sorting, I would love to have additional people who would be willing to enter codes as well as to deliver caps/lids when necessary. Through this Ministry, by simply entering codes, the congregation has donated over \$200.00 to organizations such as The USO, The Boys and Girls Club of America, St. Jude's Children's Hospital, and Children's Memorial Hospital. (Each cap is worth a 5-cent donation, and the time that it takes is minimal.)



An opportunity has come up for Pastor Ryden to participate in a 13-day trip to Israel and Jordan in April of 2021. He will get a chance to experience the Holy Land in an up-close-and-personal-way and to bring his experiences back to Hope in the form of bible studies, sermons, teachings and stories.

The trip will take place between April 28—May 11th, 2021. Areas that will be visited include Galilee, Bethlehem, Bethany, the Jordan River, the Dead Sea, Mt of Olives, the Garden of Gethsemane, the Upper Room, Mt Nebo and many other locations. The full cost of the trip, which includes air fare, hotel, most food, taxes, gratuity, visas and trip



insurance is \$6,000. That equates to approximately \$425 per day. Additional information is included in the brochure on the bulletin board in the Narthex.


All worship services are in need of more people to assist in setting up, resetting, and clean up of communion.

You will be trained. **It's easy!** It's just once a month and you will make sure that we can have communion at all worship services.


