"On the mountain of the Lord it will be provided."

Genesis 22:14

Greetings from Lincoln, II. That's where I have been all week with Kari and four youth from our church serving through Group Mission Trips. Our crew has been busy serving a wonderful local resident named Connie by building a new porch and steps and painting the shutters of her house among other things. We should be finishing up our work today (Thursday) and perhaps be reassigned to help another group finish their work. This is my 10th mission trip through Group Mission Trips and I am constantly amazed at how God continues to work and accomplish his kingdom goals in and through us.

This week I feel a bit like Abraham learning once again to live with complete trust in God. After decades of being taught that God will keep his promise to give Abraham a son, and after decades of doubt and uncertainty, God finally fulfills his promise and Isaac is born. But did Abraham truly learn to trust God? Years later, God told Abraham to take his son Isaac, the promised child, the one through whom God would continue to fulfill all his promises, and sacrifice him to the Lord. What would Abraham do? Abraham did learn to trust in God, even when it seemed impossible. Abraham was willing to sacrifice his son, believing that somehow God would still be able to do what he had promised.

Of course, we know how the story ends. Just as Abraham was about to sacrifice his son, an angel stopped him. Abraham had passed the test and God gave him the way out. The Lord provided a ram to sacrifice in place of Isaac. From that time on, there was a saying among God's people: "On the mountain of the Lord, it will be provided."

Many years later, perhaps in that same exact spot, the Lord provided another substitute for those who believe. What Abraham was asked to do, God the Father did. He offered up his only Son for the sins of the world. Now all who trust in him receive life back from death just as Isaac was spared. On the mountain of the Lord it was provided.

That truth has been revealed to me again and again in little ways on this mission trip. I made the mistake of grabbing the wrong box of equipment from my garage when I left on Sunday. Instead of the box with my circular saw and other much needed tools, I grabbed the one that had the stuff I was going to leave behind. I couldn't believe my stupidity! But God provided. We needed a ½" spade bit. God provided through our resident who just happened to have one. We needed a circular saw. Our resident had that too. We needed a jig saw. Guess what. She had that too. Again and again, we were provided with what we needed to serve and get the job done.




Communion Assistance Needed:



We will visit the Sea of Galilee and the cities of Tiberius, Capernaum and Magdala. We will visit the Church of Nativity in Bethlehem and follow the Stations of the Cross along the Via Dolorosa in Jerusalem. An opportunity has come up for Pastor Ryden to participate in a 13-day trip to Israel and Jordan in April of 2021. He will get a chance to experience the Holy up-close-and-personal-way and to bring his experiences back to Land in an Hope in the form of bible studies, sermons, teachings and stories.

The trip will take place between June 7-16, 2022. Areas that will be visited include Galilee, Bethlehem, Bethany, the Jordan River, the Dead Sea, Mt of Olives, the Garden of Gethsemane, the Upper Room, Mt Nebo and many other locations. The full cost of the



trip, which includes air fare, hotel, most food, taxes, gratuity, visas and trip insurance is \$6,000. That equates to approximately \$425 per day.
